

SUGGESTED TREE SPECIES

LARGE (OVER 20 METRES)

Ash

- Fraxinus excelsior (*native tree, light open canopy*)
- Fraxinus excelsior 'Westhof Glorie' (*selected form of common Ash*)

Oak

- Quercus cerris (*Turkey Oak*)
- Quercus rubra (*Red Oak*)

Beech

- Fagus sylvatica (*common form, graceful habit, holds leaves late*)
- Fagus sylvatica 'Dawky' (*upright branch habit, autumn colour*)

Lime

- Tilia cordata 'Green Spire' (*aphid-free, erect form, dark green leaves*)
- Tilia cordata 'Swedish Upright' (*columnar habit*)
- Tilia platyphyllos 'Fastigiata' (*erect growth habit*)
- Tilia platyphyllos 'Rubra' (*semi-erect growth habit, red twigs*)

Others

- Acer platanoides (*Norway Maple*)
- Aesculus hippocastanum (*Horse Chestnut, white flowers, 'Conkers'*)
- Pinus sylvestris (*native Scots Pine, coniferous*)
- Larix spp (*Larch, deciduous conifer*)

MEDIUM (10-20 METRES)

Rowan

- Sorbus aucuparia (*native form, white flowers, red fruits*)
- Sorbus aucuparia 'Asplenifolia', (*upright habit, autumn colour, red fruits*)
- Sorbus 'Joseph Rock' (*compact head, yellow fruit, autumn colour*)
- Sorbus 'Embley' (*erect habit, glowing red in autumn*)
- Sorbus vilmorinii (*fern-like leaves, spreading habit, autumn colour*)

Whitebeam

- Sorbus aria (*common form, white flowers, red berries*)
- Sorbus aria 'Lutescens' (*grey-green foliage, round head*)
- Sorbus aria 'Majestica' (*larger leaves and fruits, handsome tree*)

Birch

- Betula pendula (*native species, white stems*)
- Betula pubescens (*native, tolerates damp conditions*)
- Betula jacquemontii (*dazzling white stem*)
- Betula 'Dalecarlica' (*graceful tree with cut leaves*)
- Betula papyrifera (*white papery bark*)
- Betula utilis (*coppery-brown peeling bark*)

Ash

- Fraxinus oxycarpa 'Raywood' (*compact, plum coloured in autumn*)
- Fraxinus ornus (*flowers in May*)

Others

- Carpinus betulus 'Fastigiata' (*Hornbeam, upright, autumn colour*)
- Laburnum vossii (*semi-erect/spreading, pendulous yellow flowers*)
- Pyrus salicifolia 'Pendula' (*weeping habit, white flowers*)
- Pyrus calleryana 'Chanticleer' (*columnar form, autumn colour*)

- Parrotia persica (*pendulous habit, autumn colour, red flowers in winter*)

SMALL (UP TO 10 METRES)

Cherries/Almonds

- Prunus cerasifera 'Nigra' (*deep purple leaves, pink flowers*)
- Prunus x hillieri 'Spire' (*conical form, pink flowers*)
- Prunus dulcis 'Erecta' (*columnar form, pink flowers*)
- Prunus 'Pandora' (*pink blossom, good colour*)
- Prunus 'Accolade' (*spreading branches, double pink flowers*)
- Prunus subhirtella 'Autumnalis' (*spreading habit, autumn colour*)
- Prunus serrula (*broad habit, white flowers, shiny black*)

Crab Apple

- Malus 'Katherine' (*pink flowers, red and yellow fruits*)
- Malus 'van Eseltine' (*erect habit, pink flowers, yellow fruits*)
- Malus 'Golden Hornet' (*white flowers, yellow fruits*)
- Malus 'Liset' (*upright habit, red flowers*)
- Malus floribunda (*crimson buds, white flowers, red/yellow fruit*)

Rowan

- Sorbus 'Apricot Lady' (*apricot-yellow fruits, rich autumn colour*)
- Sorbus cashmiriana (*soft pink flowers, white berries*)
- Sorbus discolor (*white flowers, yellow fruits, autumn colour*)
- Sorbus 'Sheerwater Seedling' (*compact head, orange-red fruits*)

Hawthorns

- Crataegus crus-gali (*attractive fruits and flowers, long thorns*)
- Crataegus x grignonensis (*bright red fruits, holds leaves late*)
- Crataegus monogyna (*native, white scented flowers, red fruits*)
- Crataegus monogyna 'Stricta' (*upright habit*)
- Crataegus prunifolia (*brilliant berries, shiny leaves*)
- Crataegus 'Paul's Scarlet' (*double red flowers*)

Others

- Acer griseum (*Paper-bark Maple good autumn colour*)
- Acer pseudoplatanus 'Brilliantissimum' (*good foliage colour*)
- Acer rufinerve (*striped bark, good autumn colour*)
- Amelanchier laevis (*good foliage colour, white flowers*)

EVERGREENS

Holly

- Ilex altaclarensis 'Golden King' (*good golden variegated form*)
- Ilex aquifolium (Standard Dark green)
- Ilex aquifolium 'Golden Queen' (*Dark green with yellow margin*)
- Ilex aquifolium 'J.C Van Tol' (*Shining green, spineless, large crops of berries*)

Yew

- Taxus baccata (numerous forms varying in shape and colour)
- Taxus baccata 'Elegantissima' (*Golden*)
- Taxus baccata 'Fastigiata' (*Dense, columnar, dark green*)
