At the Stalled Spaces event, communities and land owners told how they had used their grant to turn unproductive land into an asset in their local area.

The local community groups were also thanked by Cllr Graham for helping to ensure the success of the initiative which recently won Europe-wide recognition at The City to City Barcelona (Fostering Arts & Design) Awards and each project presented with a certificate from our partners in Barcelona.

It comes as it was also revealed that the Stalled Spaces project has been awarded Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games Legacy status. Stalled Spaces will fall within the Green legacy theme - which is one of six themes which are part of Glasgow's efforts to ensure all Glaswegians benefit from Games legacy.

Councillor Archie Graham, Executive Member for the Commonwealth Games at Glasgow City Council, speaking at a Stalled Spaces event held in the City Chambers, said: "Glasgow is very good at being innovative and creative about how to engage with, listen to and improve the lives of those living in our city.

"This project is a shining example of a Glasgow 2014 Legacy Project which gives local people the power to take over and transform their communities, bringing economic, environmental and social benefits across our city."
