For **Glasgow** children and young people looked after by foster carers or residential carers

If you are in **continuing care** or **aftercare** we can work with you up to your 26th birthday

How can we help? we can...

- visit you where you live
- provide you with information about your rights
- listen and support you to provide your views and opinions
- help to ensure you are involved in decision making
- help you to plan and prepare for meetings
- speak to people on your behalf
- keep you informed and give you feedback
- offer a range of opportunities for you to get involved and have fun
- get your views on matters that affect you
- celebrate and share your achievements
- help you make a complaint

Here are some of your rights

- to be safe
- to be treated with respect
- to be well looked after
- to speak up and have your opinions listened to and taken into account
- to achieve all you can
