General Notes and Background

Introduction and Background

These notes accompany the various tables, charts, maps and profiles that are published together as the Social Work Area Demographics Data Compendium (2014). The compendium is intended to provide essential demographics information at social work area level, to support social work staff and managers, health colleagues and other partners, in the planning, development and delivery of services to the people of Glasgow.

A general demographic profile of the three social work areas and the city is provided, including a breakdown of age, gender and ethnicity, in addition to information on deprivation and the health, disability and vulnerability of the population. A profile of social work service users is also provided. The data compendium updates the previous 'Social Work Area Demographics' report and tables published in 2011.

Methodology and Notes

The 2011 census was used as the main source of population data for the demographics tables because of its currency and the unique richness and reliability of the dataset. A wide range of data is available from the census, some of which cannot be reliably sourced elsewhere, however it is not comprehensive. For this reason, data from other sources (see below) has been combined with census data or used in its own right to allow a more comprehensive profile of the population of Glasgow to be produced.

The National Records of Scotland (NRS) mid year population estimates have been published since the 2011 census was conducted. These estimate that the total population of Glasgow has increased by 0.56% or 3,305 since the 2011 census, rising from 593,245 at 27th March 2011 to an estimated 596,550 at 30th June 2013.

The demographics tables were compiled from Scottish Neighbourhood Statistics (SNS) data zone level data which was then aggregated up to social work area level figures. (A data zone is an area with a population of between 500 and 1,000 household residents). Adjustments required to be made to data for all tables in respect of data zone S01003502 (within the North East ward and North East social work area) which has been affected by a boundary change that occurred after the 2011 census was conducted. A total of 617 people from this data zone have been migrated to the North Lanarkshire area from Glasgow City as a result of the change.

Since the 2011 census results do not take account of this boundary change below Glasgow City level, it should be noted that information downloaded directly from the Census 2011 website at multi member ward or other sub Glasgow level may not reconcile to the figures published within the demographics tables here. There is also an additional anomaly whereby census data downloaded directly from the census 2011 website at multi member ward level is subject to rounding and does not reconcile to data aggregated up from data zone level to multi member ward level. A discrepancy occurs at the boundary between North East and North West social work areas, affecting only these areas (South figures are unaffected). The tables produced here are accurate and match data already published by Glasgow City Council Development and Regeneration Services.

Four of the data zones falling within the Glasgow boundary have a nil population according to the 2011 census, however still feature within the SIMD 2012. These are S01003505 and S01003548 in the North East area falling within the Sighthill, Roystonhill & Germiston and Springburn neighbourhoods. Data zones S01003031 and S01003319 from the South area fall within the Castlemilk and Ibrox & Kingston neighbourhoods.

Data Compendium Format

The full data compendium is set out in this document and comprises:

- **demographic profiles** for Glasgow and each of the 3 social work areas, providing brief descriptions of the demographic nature of the areas
- **quick reference factsheets** for Glasgow and each of the 3 social work areas, listing key statistics for the areas, with comparison to Glasgow rates (where applicable)
- detailed **tables** of data, compiled or calculated by social work area with Glasgow totals
- **charts** produced from a selection of data provided in the tables
- **maps** providing graphical representation of selected key data from the tables

The compendium data noted above is also available via individual excel and pdf files on CONNECT and GCC internet pages for ease of reference.

GLASGOW CITY DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE

GENERAL POPULATION

●At Census 2011, Glasgow City's population 593,245 — highest proportion of Scotland's population (11.2%); average social work area population 197,748.

●Of the 3 social work areas South 219,244 (37.0%) with highest population; North West 206,483 (34.9%) and North East 167,518 (28.2%) lowest population.

●Glasgow's average multi-member population 28,250; populations range from 21,991 Springburn to 33,038 Partick West; thirteen of the twenty one wards above average—3 in North East, 5 in North West, 5 in South.

●Glasgow's population comprises of 108,259

children 0-17 (only South 43,163 above average); **adults 18-64** (North West 147,528 and South 145,152 above average); and **older people 65 and over** (Only South 30,929 above average).

●Glasgow's average multi-member ward **child population** 5,155; child population across multi-member wards ranges from 2,048 Anderston/ City to 7,917 Greater Pollok.

●Glasgow's average multi-member ward **adult population** 19,182; adult population across multi-member wards ranges from 14,149 Springburn to 25,069 Anderston/ City .

●Glasgow's average multi-member ward **older person population** 3,913; adult population across multi-member wards ranges from 2,029 Anderston/ City to 5,325 Craigton.

●**City's total population** expected to change +2.5% between 2012 and 2017 (from 595,080 to 609,707); **child population** expected to change +2.4% (from 108,722 to 111,339); **adult population** expected to change +2.6% (from 403,400 to 413,880); **older person population** expected to change +1.8% (from 82,958 to 84,488).

●Glasgow's proportion of females higher than males, 51.8% and 48.2%.

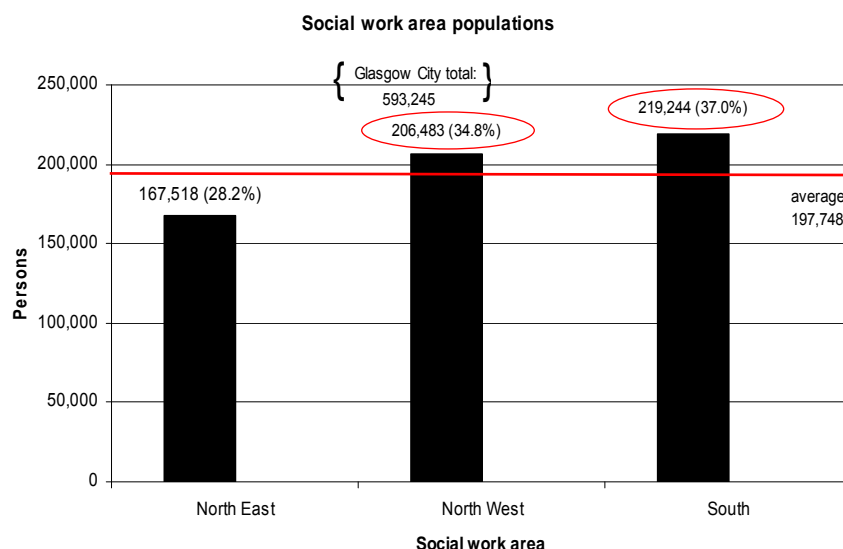
● Glasgow's White population rate 88.4% higher than BME population rate 11.6%. Of the 3 social work areas South's BME population rate 14.2% higher than City average. Of City total population 82.8% born in Scotland. Compared to City average rate born in Scotland, South's population in line with 82.8%; North West's lower with 76.9% and North East's higher with 87.2%. Glasgow's population 15,351 (2.7%) 'do not speak English well' or 'at all.' Similar rates for 3 social work areas—North East 2.6%, North West 2.5%, and South 2.8%.

●Glasgow's BME population 68,684; average 1,226 spread across 56 Neighbourhood areas; BME population across Neighbourhood areas ranges from 62 Carmunock to 4,757 Govanhill.

●Health rating of general population in Glasgow, 8.7% 'bad' or 'very bad' health. North East (10.7%) above City average while North West (7.7%) and South (8.1%) below.

●Glasgow's population suffering with one or more long term health conditions equals 183,818 (31.0%). North (33.7%) above City average while North West (29.0%) below. South (30.8%) in line with City average. Long term health conditions tabled below with City and locality rates:

- Glasgow's population, 75,864 (12.8%) 'limited a lot' to do day to day activities—North East (15.4%) above City average, North West (11.4%) below, and South (12.2%) in line with City average.
- Three in 10 of the 15% most deprived data zones in Scotland (976) are within Glasgow City (288, 29.5%) — highest proportion for a local authority; average deprived data zones for Glasgow Social Work areas 96; North East (116 data zones) above City average while North West (83 data zones) and South (89 data zones) below.
- Two-fifths (238,029, 40.1%) of City population live in 15% most deprived data zones. North East (54.8%) of its population above the City average while North West (33.8%) and South (34.8%) below.
- Half (49.6%) of Glasgow's population 294,038 live in rented accommodation; 32.9% in social rented accommodation, 15.9% in private rented accommodation; and 0.8% rent free.
- Of total households in Glasgow, approximately a tenth (26,513, 9.3%) are one parent with dependent children—North East (11.5%) above City average while North West (7.8%) below and South (9.0%) in line with City average.
- Of general population living in households in Glasgow, total 9.3% (53,672) unpaid care provided:
 - 4.4% (25,293) provide between 1 to 9 hours
 - 2.0% (11,323) provide between 20 to 49 hours
 - 2.9% (17,056) provide 50 hours or more

CHILD AND OLDER PERSON VULNERABILITY

- A third (35.7%) of Glasgow's general child population (0-17) 38,663 is vulnerable with 3 indicators (employment, income and education). Of total, two fifths 15,292 (39.6%) in North East; less than a third 11,330 (29.3%) in North West; and less than a third 12,041 (31.1%) in South.
- Almost half (46.6%) of Glasgow's general pensionable age population (60/65 and over) 44,949 is vulnerable with 2 or 3 indicators (older people aged 75 and over; older people aged 65 and over living alone; older people 75 and over living alone; and/ or older people aged 60/ 65 and over receiving pension credit). This is used for staffing/ general budget calculations.
- Almost half (48.4%) of Glasgow's general older person population 37,724 living in households (65 and over) is vulnerable weighted with 4 indicators (older people aged 65-84 in households; older people aged 85 and over in households; older people aged 65 and over with day to day activities limited and bad/ very bad health; older people aged 75 and over living alone). This is used for homecare budget calculations.

SOCIAL WORK SERVICE USER POPULATION (CHILDREN AND FAMILIES AND COMMUNITY CARE)

- At June 2014, 50,724 social work service users (excluding Criminal Justice and Homelessness) were in receipt of social care service from Glasgow City, 8.6% of the general population. Average social work area service user population 16,908.
- Glasgow's service user population—approximately a third across each of the 3 social work areas with South 17,517 (34.5%) showing slightly higher. North East 16,875 (33.3%) and North West 16,332 (32.2%).
- Glasgow's service user population comprises of 10,223 (20.2%) **children 0-17**, 20,440 (40.3%) **adults 18-64**, and 19,552 (38.5%) **older people 65 and over**. 509 (1.0%) not grouped as ages were not known. Of City's general population 9.4% are child service users, 5.1% adults, and 38.5% older people.
- Slightly more female service users (26,260, 51.8 %) than male ones (23,127, 45.6%).
- Over three quarters 39,813 (78.5%) service users are of white ethnic origin and 2,267 (4.5%) of BME. Ethnicity of 8,636 (1.5%) service users recorded as unknown. BME population ranges from 1,128 (6.4%) in South to 376 (2.2%) in North East.
- Glasgow's service user population of 50,724 is broken down by following care groups: **older people/physical disability** (18,387, 36.2%); **children and families** (12,150, 24.0%); **addictions** (10,601, 20.9%); **learning disability** (2,711, 5.3%); **mental health** (2,631, 5.2%); **adult physical disability** (1,947, 3.8%); **other adult services** (5,223, 10.3%). A number of service users will be recorded under one or more category.
- Over half (27,531, 58.6%) service users live in 15% most deprived data zones. At locality level, North East has highest rate 71.0% living in 15% most deprived data zones compared to North West's 54.7% and South's 50.2%.

● Rate of service users living in 15% most deprived areas in Glasgow as follows:

- all years—almost a third 27,531 (58.6%)
- children—over two thirds 6,275 (67.8%)
- adults—two thirds 11,981 (64.7%)
- older people—almost half 9,038 (48.1%)

●**Children & Families**—Of Glasgow's 12,150 Children & Families service users—476 (3.9%) on CP Register; 3,498 (28.8%) Looked After; and 8,250 (67.9%) Child in Need. Possibility of children included in more than one category. North East with higher rate of it's service user population on CP Register (4.7%) and Looked After (31.6%) compared to North West (3.7%; 29.4%) and South (3.3; 25.5%) respectively.

●**Addiction cases**—January 2013, total addiction cases for Glasgow 10,139. Of these, 97.3% service users aged 18-64; 1.4% aged 65 and over; and 0.9% aged 0-17. Age banding unknown for 33 cases. Higher proportion addiction cases for North West (40.4%) than South (29.4%) and North East (25.7%).

●**Criminal Justice**—Between 1 April 2013 to 1 April 2014 in Glasgow:

- 4,689 CJSWR reports recorded. Ranging from 5 in structured deferred sentence to 1,540 for North East.
- 2,675 Community Payback Orders recorded. Ranging from 1 in several places to 943 for North East.
- 241 Throughcare licences/ orders recorded. Ranging from 44 Clyde Quay to 75 for North West.

●**Homelessness**—2013 to 2014 number of applications under the Homeless Persons Legislation equalled 6,652; number of applications assessed as homeless under the HP Legislation equalled 4,974; and number of applications where last action taken by the local authority to discharge duty equalled 4,719.

NORTH EAST SOCIAL WORK AREA DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE

GENERAL POPULATION

●At Census 2011, Glasgow City's population 593,245 — highest proportion of Scotland's population (11.2%); average social work area population 197,748.

●North East (167,518) lowest population for the three areas, just under three-tenths (28.2%) of the City's population.

●North East's average multi-member ward population 28,022; populations range from 21,991 (Springburn) to 33,444 (North East); three of the six wards above average (North East, Baillieston, and East Centre).

●North East's population comprises of 32,595 (19.5%) **children 0-17**, 110,141 (65.7%) **adults 18-64**, and 24,782 (14.8%) **older people 65 and over**, with the highest rate of older people among the three areas.

●North East's average multi-member ward **child population** 5,432; two of the six wards above average (North East, and Baillieston).

●North East's average multi-member ward **adult population** 18,357; three of the six wards above average (North East, Baillieston, and East Centre).

●North East's average multi-member ward **older person population** 4,130; four of the six wards above average (East Centre, Baillieston, Shettleston, and North East).

●**City's total population** expected to change +2.5% between 2012 and 2017 (from 595,080 to 609,707); **child population** expected to change +2.4% (from 108,722 to 111,339); **adult population** expected to change +2.6% (from 403,400 to 413,880); **older person population** expected to change +1.8% (from 82,958 to 84,488).

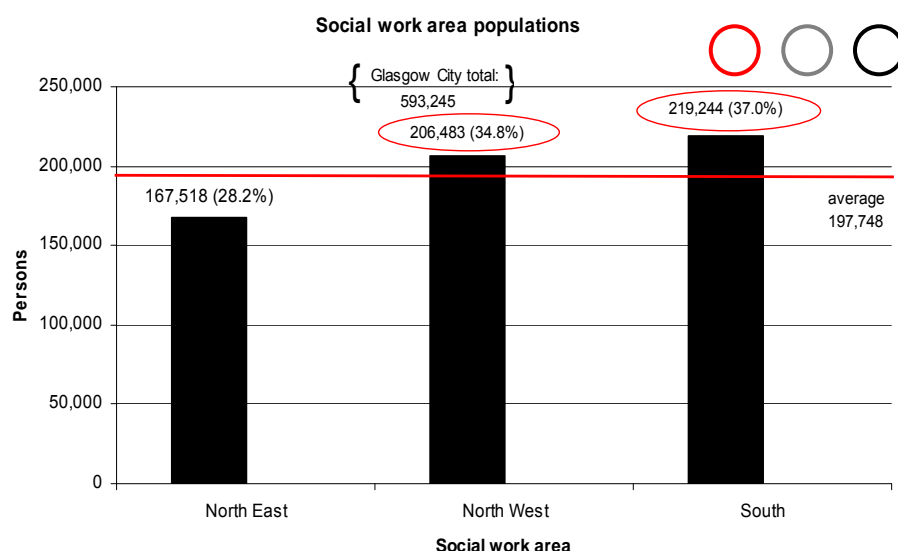
●North East's proportion of females and males in line with the City average, 51.8% and 48.2%.

●Compared to the City, North East's White population higher rate (92.3% compared to 88.4%) and BME population lower rate (7.7% compared to 11.6%); Of North East's total population 87.2% born in Scotland compared to City average 82.0%; and 2.6% 'do not speak English well' or 'at all' — in line with City average.

●North East's BME population 12,895; average 806 spread across 16 neighbourhoods; above average live in neighbourhoods Sighthill, Roystonhill, and Germiston; Springburn; Calton and Bridgeton; and Dennistoun.

●Health rating of general population in North East, 10.7% 'bad' or 'very bad' health. Higher than City average 8.7%.

●North East lowest population for three areas suffering with one or more long term health conditions 56,373 but highest rate 33.7% — above the City average 31.0%. Two thirds 111,145 (66.3%) suffering with no condition — below the City average 69.0%.

●Of its general population, 25,732 (15.4%) 'limited a lot' to do day to day activities—above the City average 12.8% and highest rate among the three areas.

- Three in 10 of the 15% most deprived data zones in Scotland (976) are within Glasgow City (288, 29.5%) — highest proportion for a local authority; average deprived data zones for Glasgow Social Work areas 96; North East above average at 116—ranging from 13 deprived data zones in multimember ward Springburn to 30 in North East.

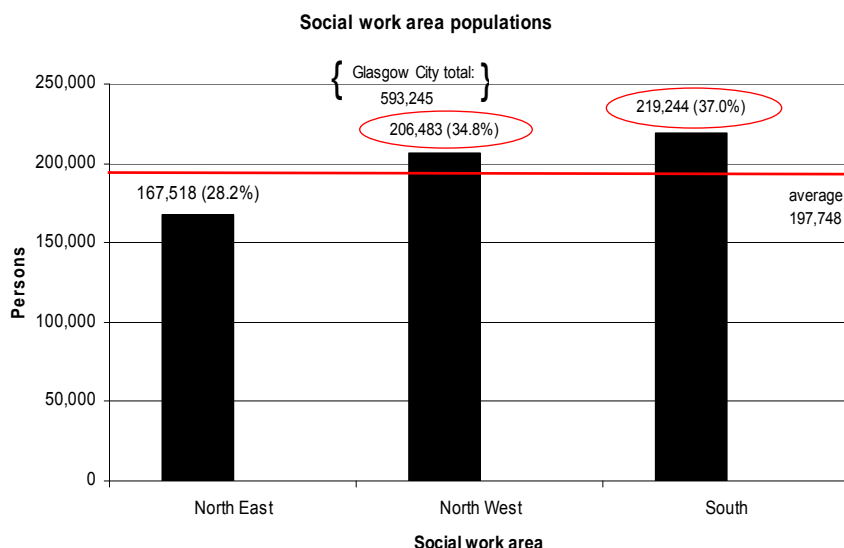

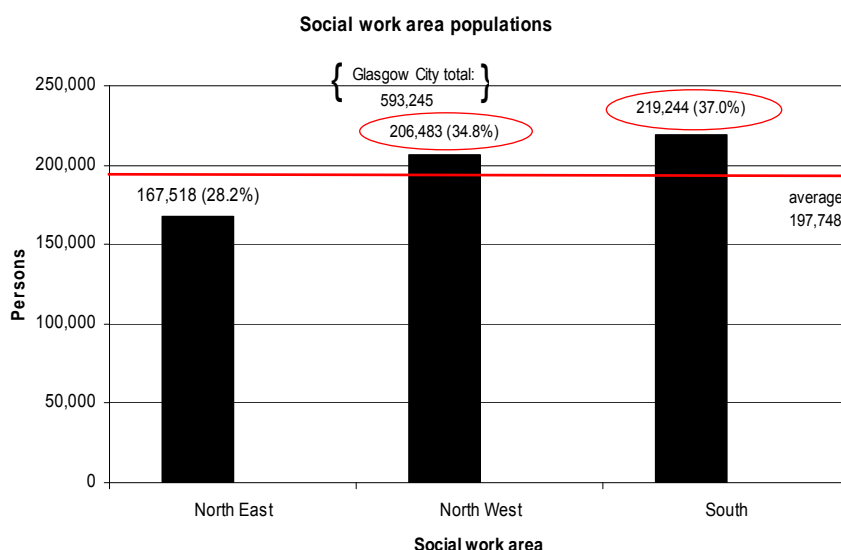

Chart 1.1: General population of Glasgow by social work area

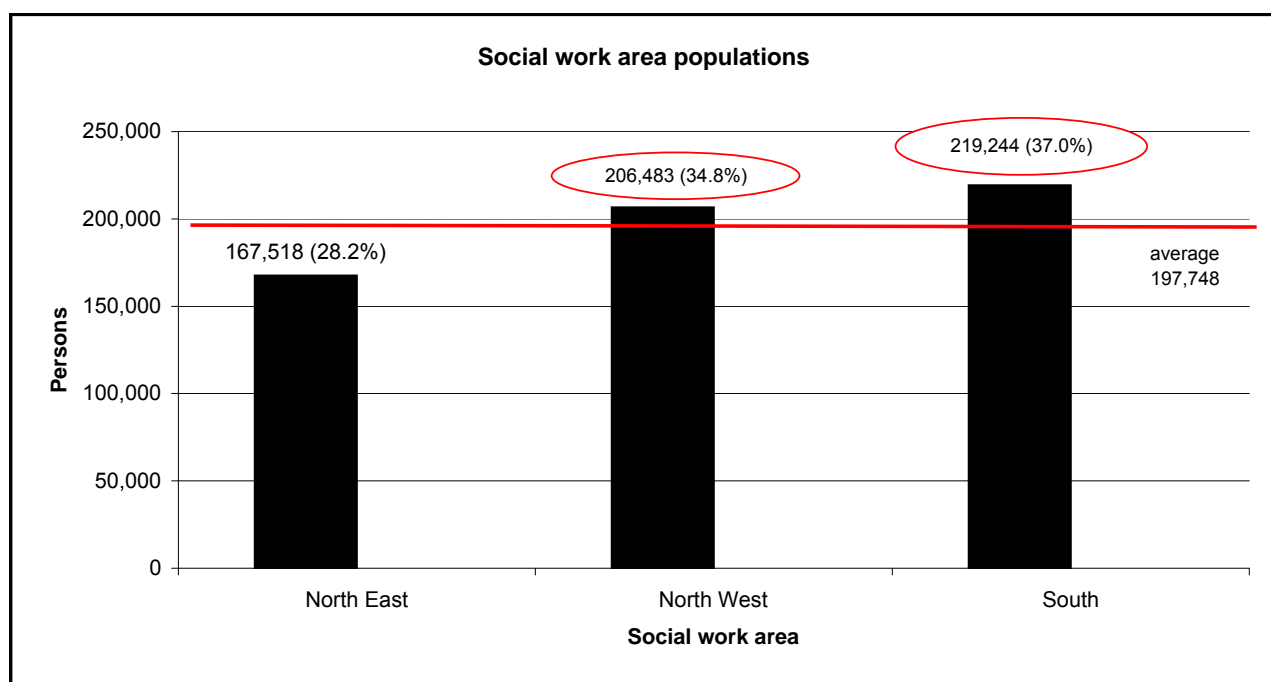
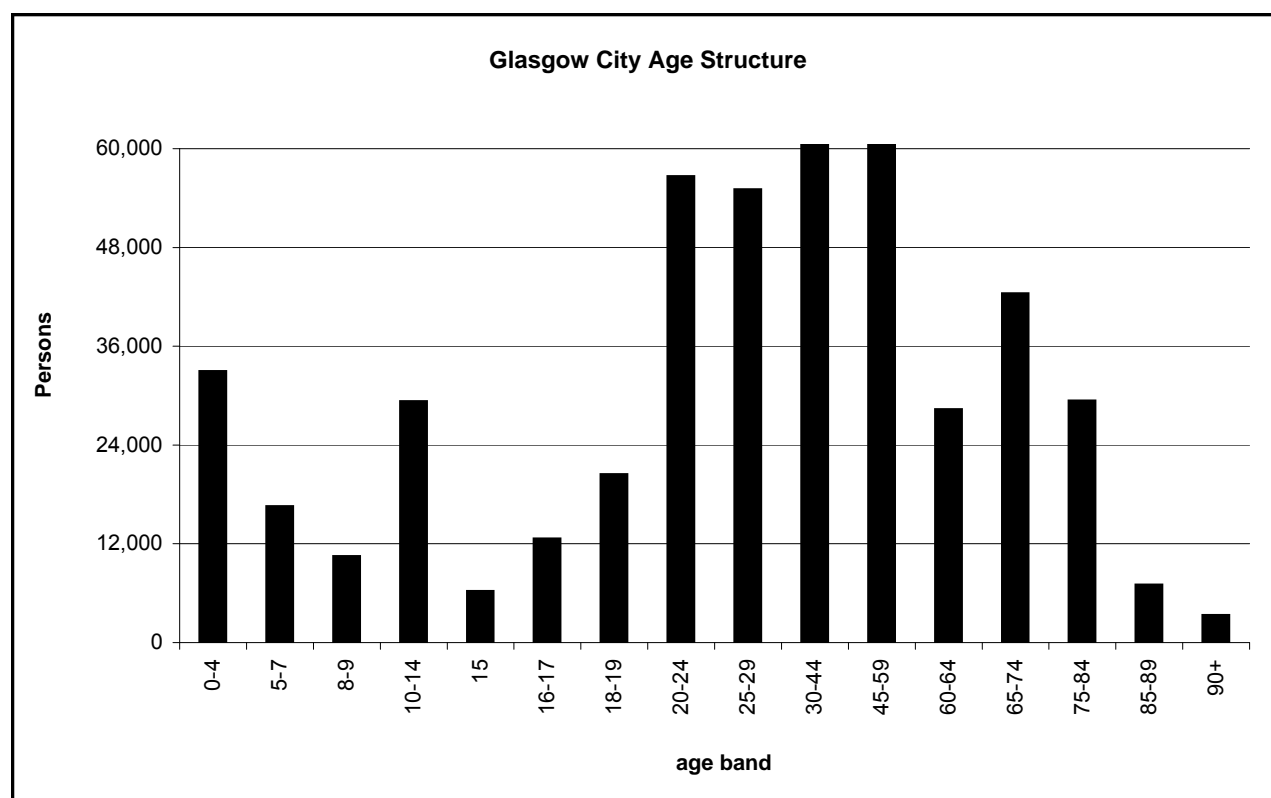


Chart 1.2: General population of Glasgow by ageband

Chart 2.1: General population of Glasgow by service user age band

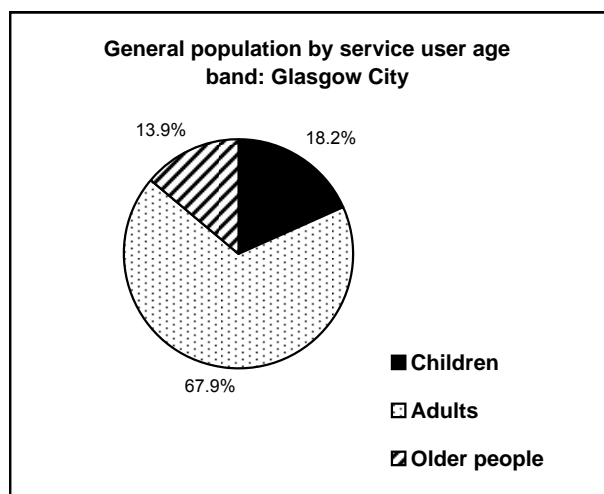


Chart 2.2: Child population of Glasgow by social work area

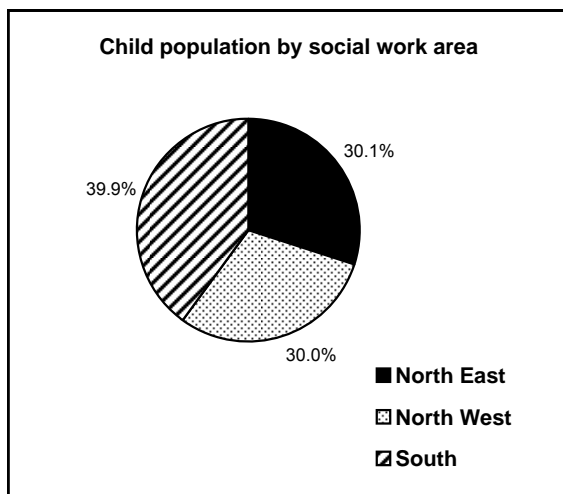


Chart 2.3: Adult population of Glasgow by social work area

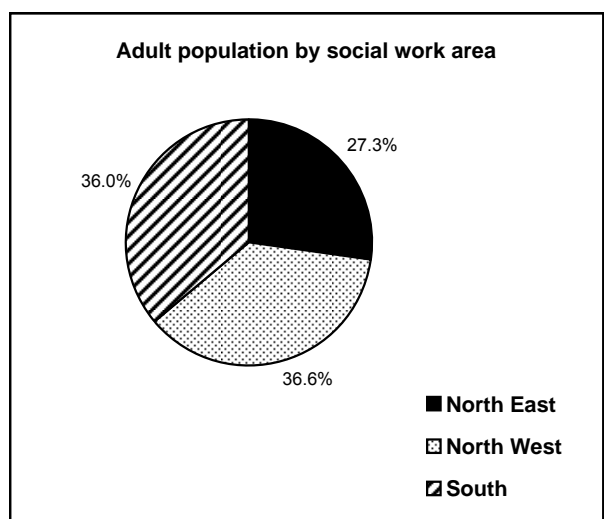
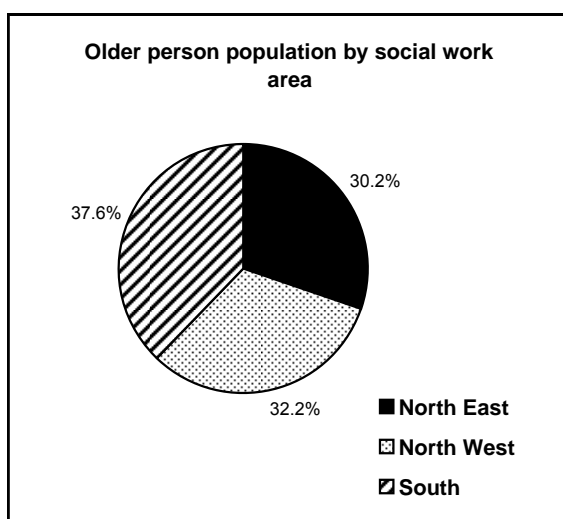


Chart 2.4: Older person population of Glasgow by social work area



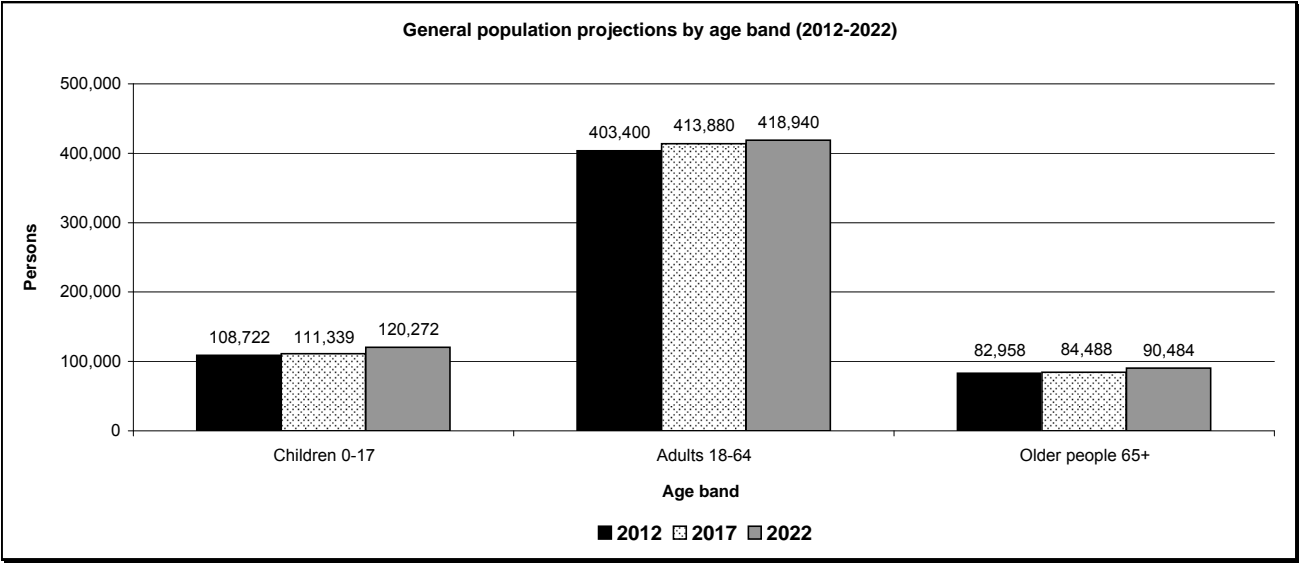

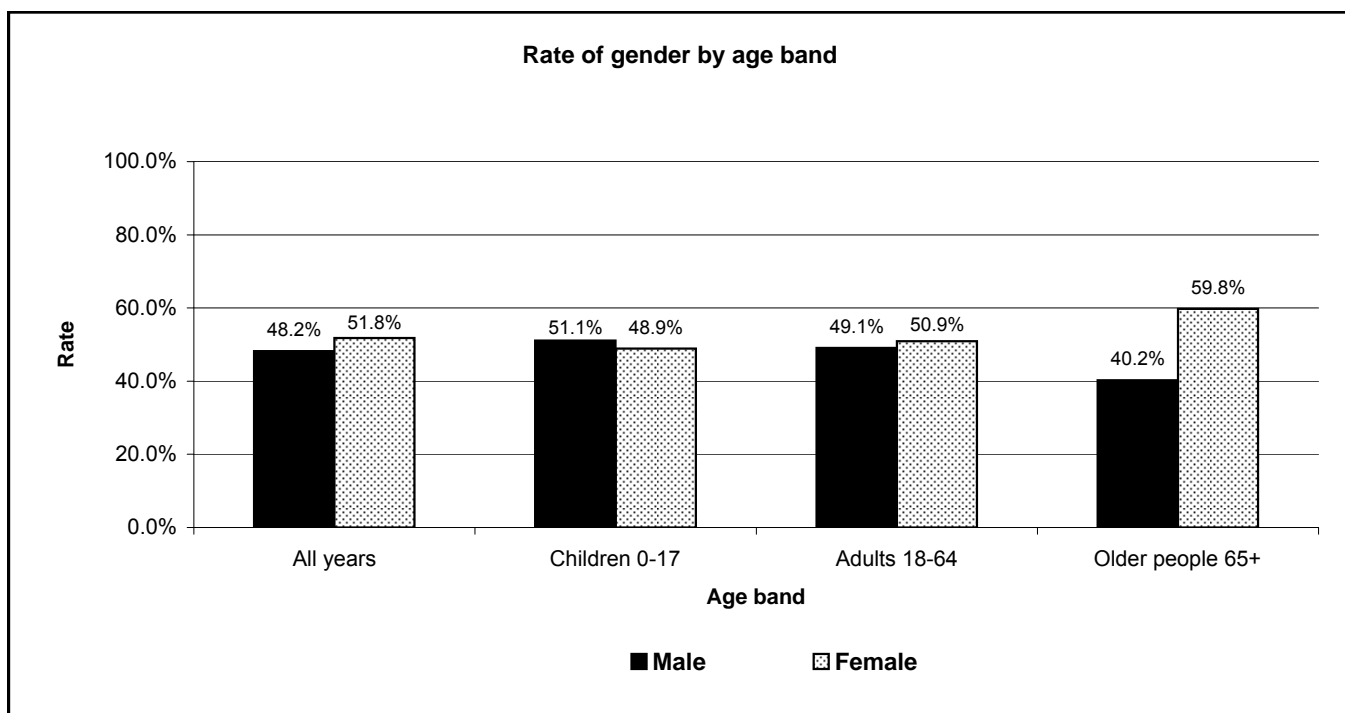

Chart 4: General population of Glasgow by gender, age band, and social work area



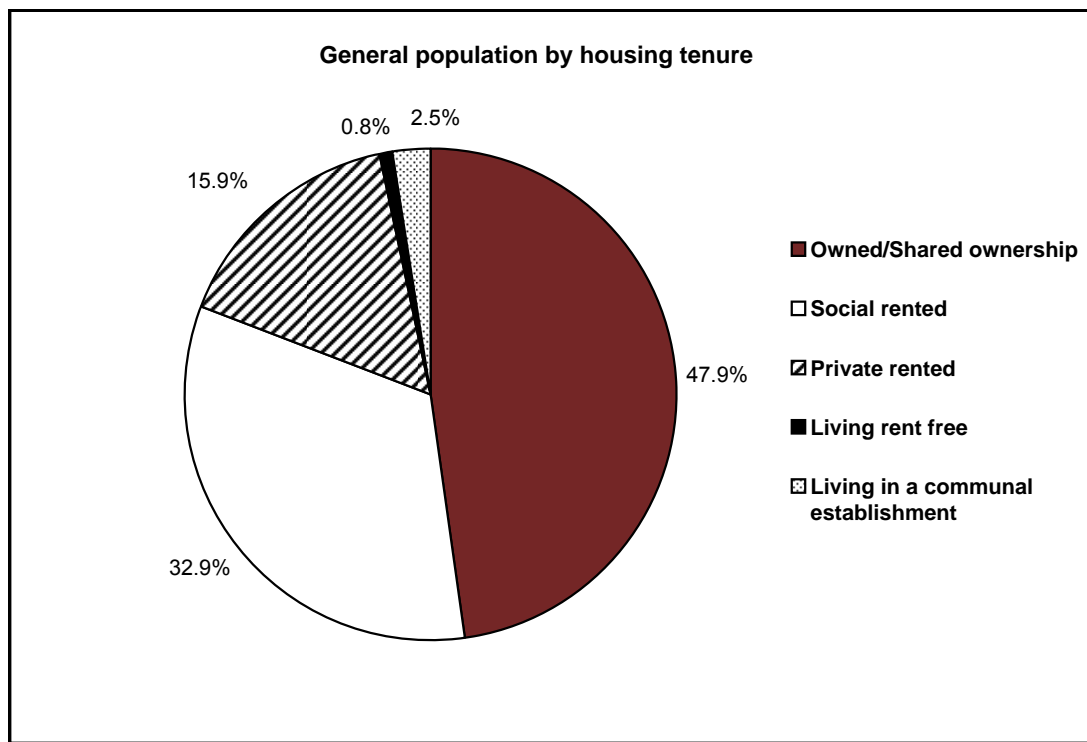

Chart 5: General population of Glasgow by housing tenure and social work area

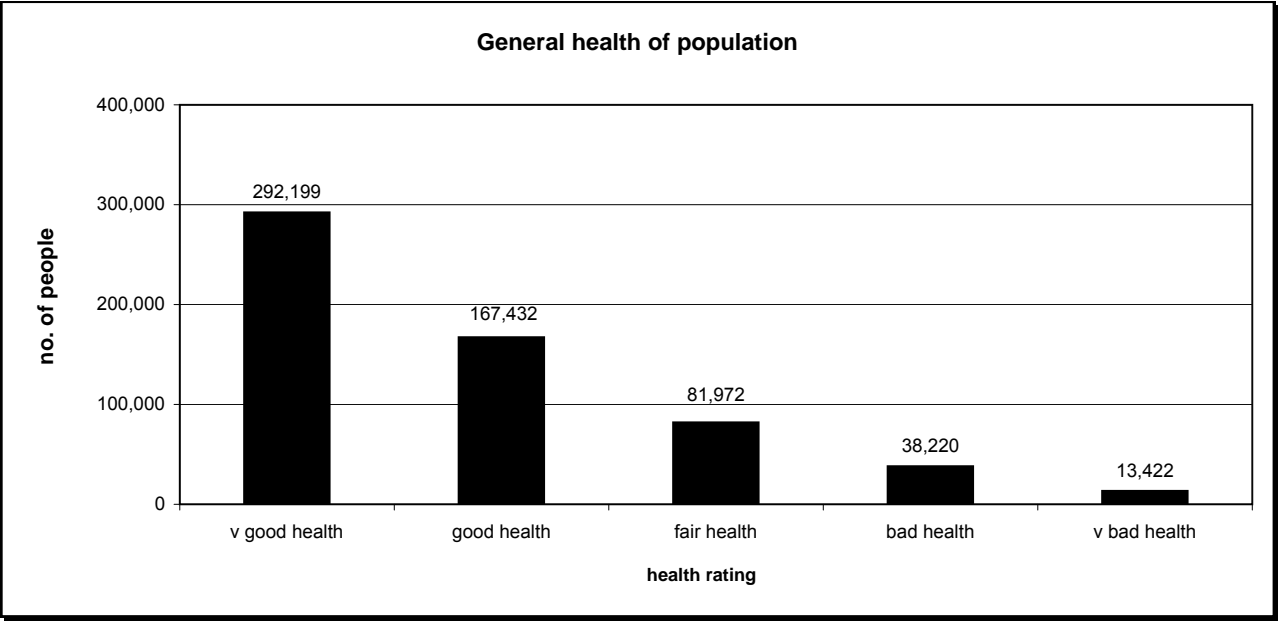

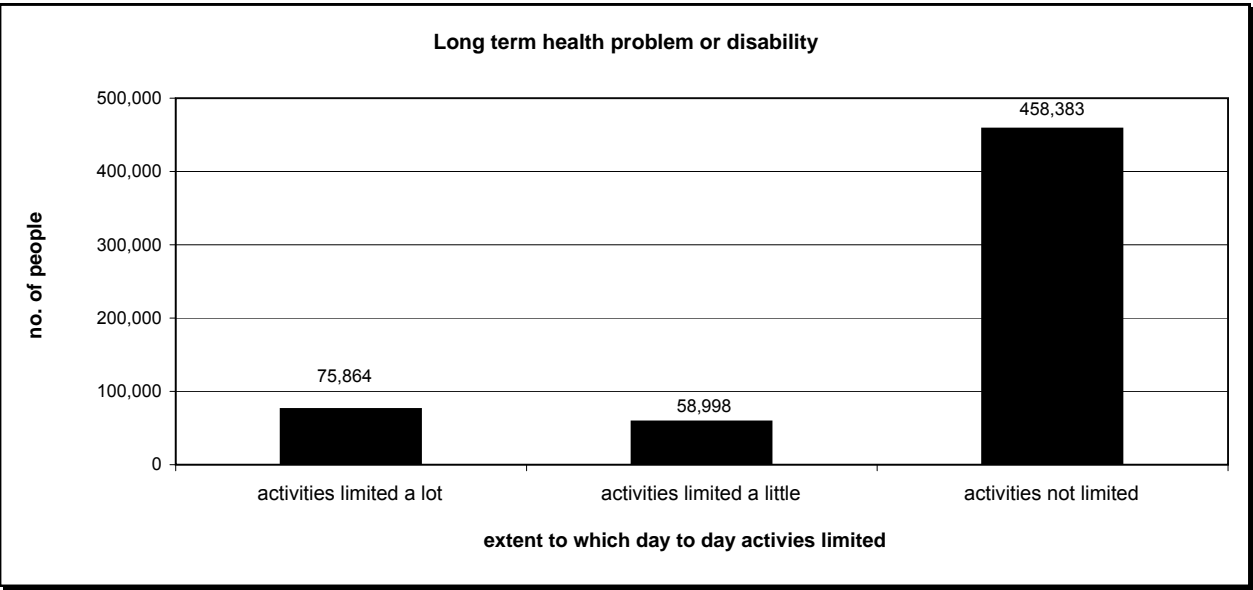
Chart 6: General population of Glasgow by health rating and social work area

Chart 8.1: Number of Scotland's 15% most deprived data zones in Glasgow by social work area (overall SIMD)

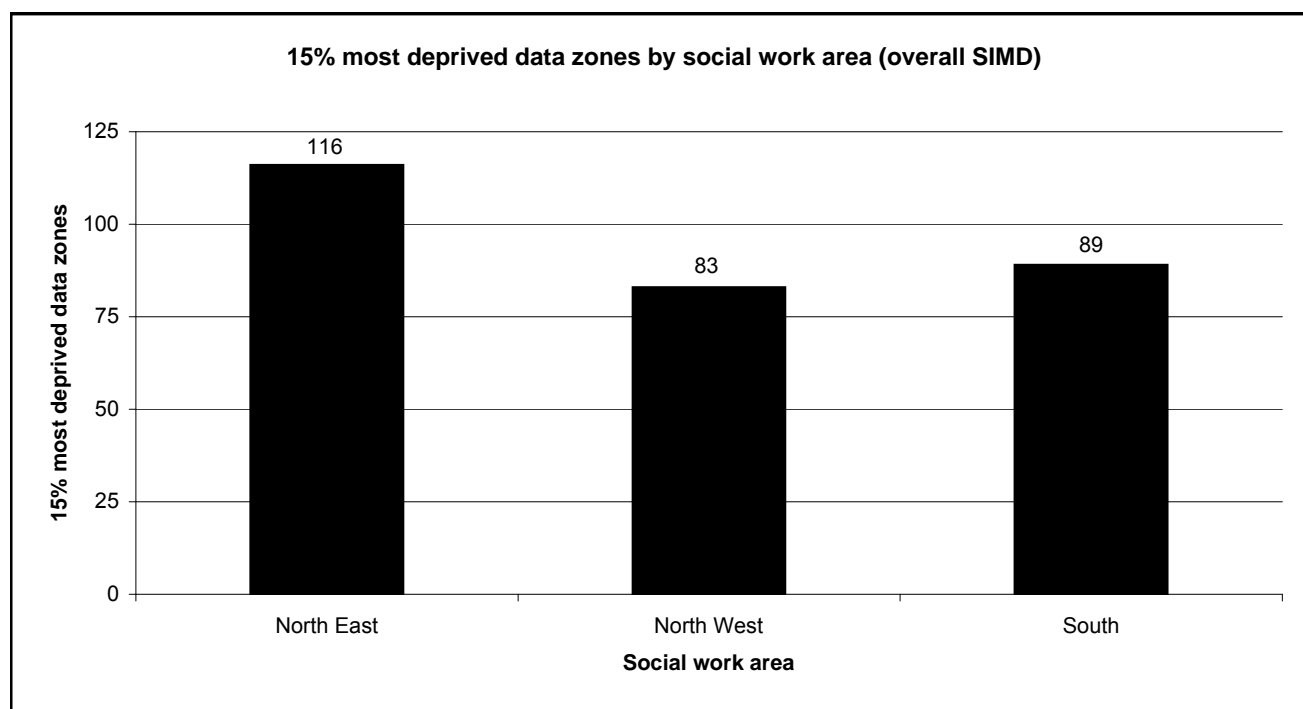
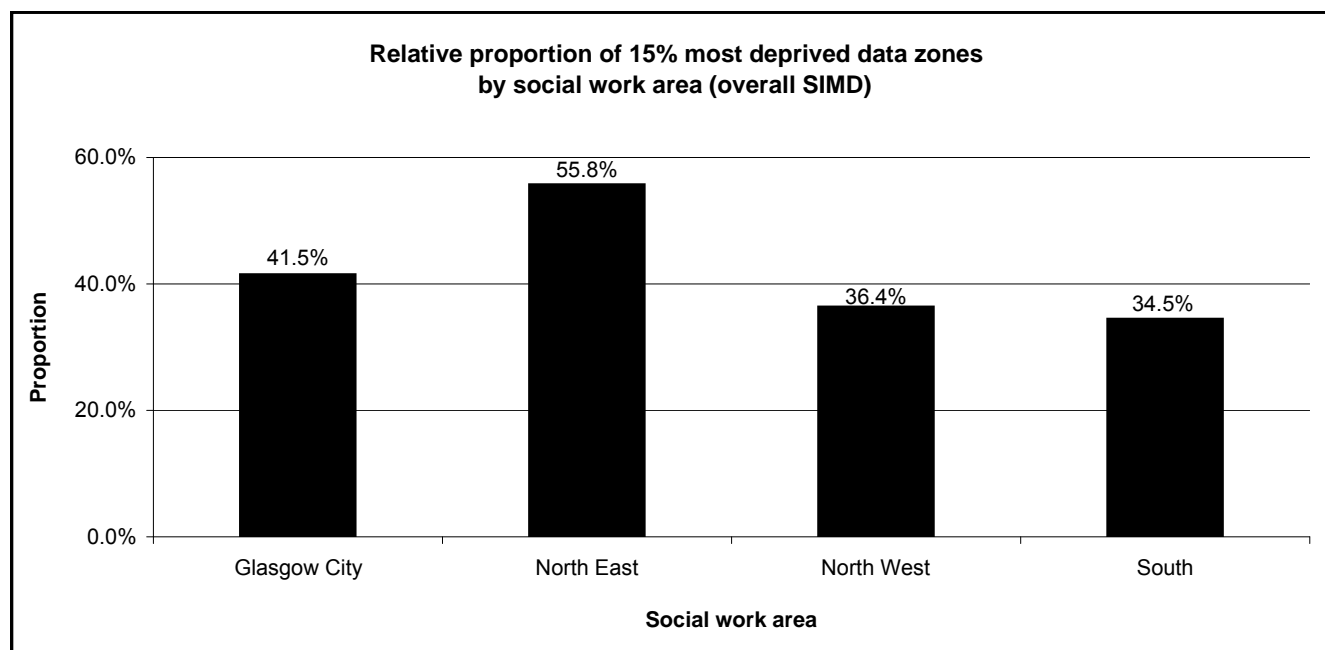


Chart 8.2: Relative Proportion of 15% most deprived data zones in Glasgow by social work area (overall SIMD)



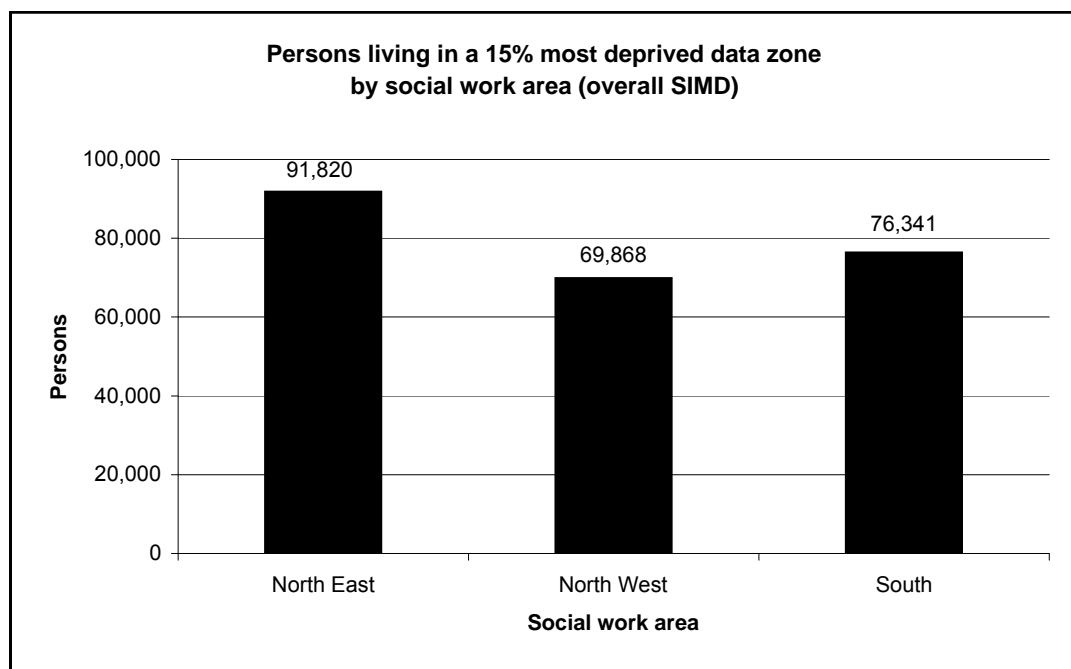

Chart 10.1: Estimates (number) of child (0-17) vulnerability in Glasgow by social work area

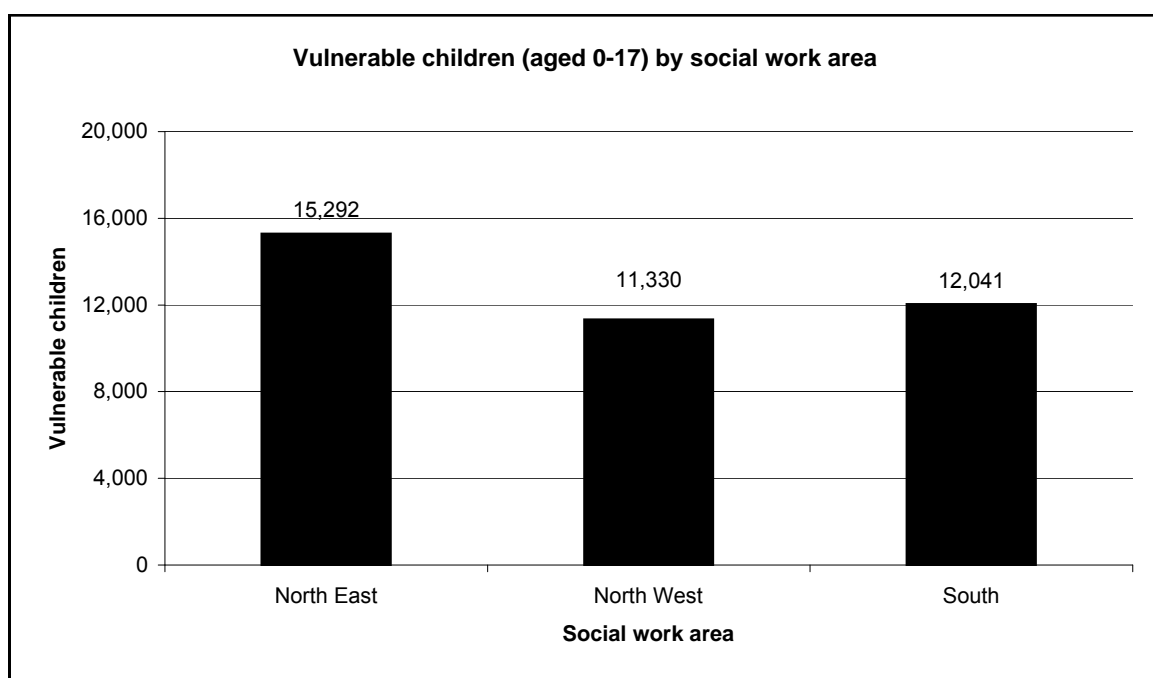
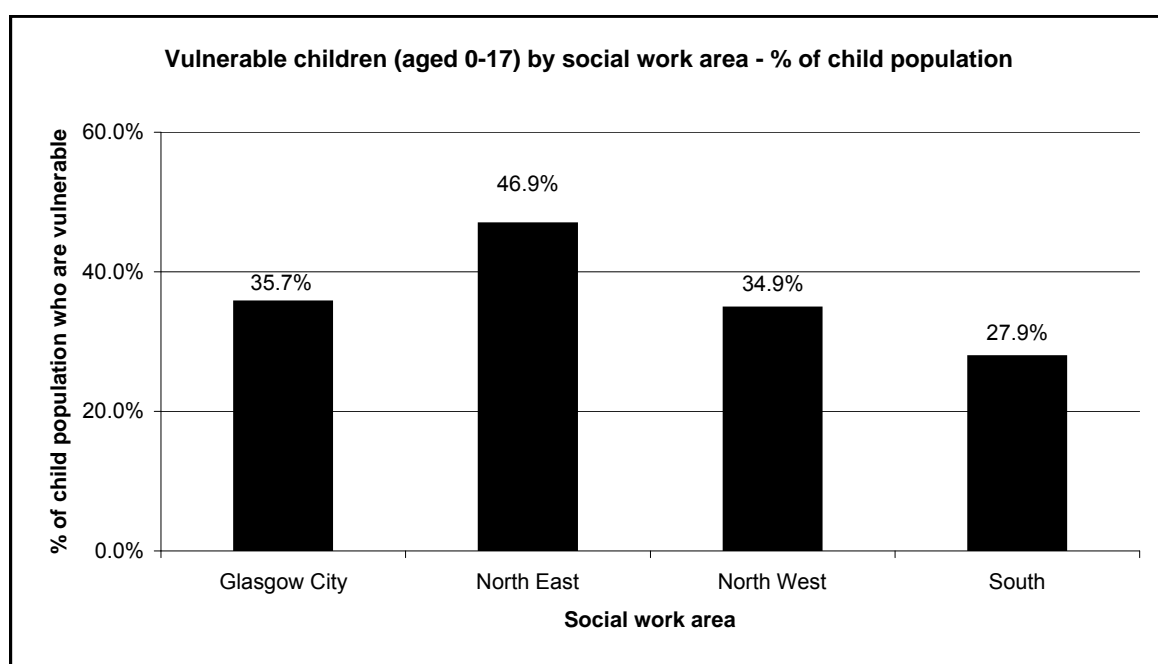


Chart 10.2: Estimates (percentage) of child (0-17) vulnerability in Glasgow by social work area

Chart 11.1: Estimates (number) of older person (60/65 and over) vulnerability in Glasgow by social work area — for staffing/general budget calculations

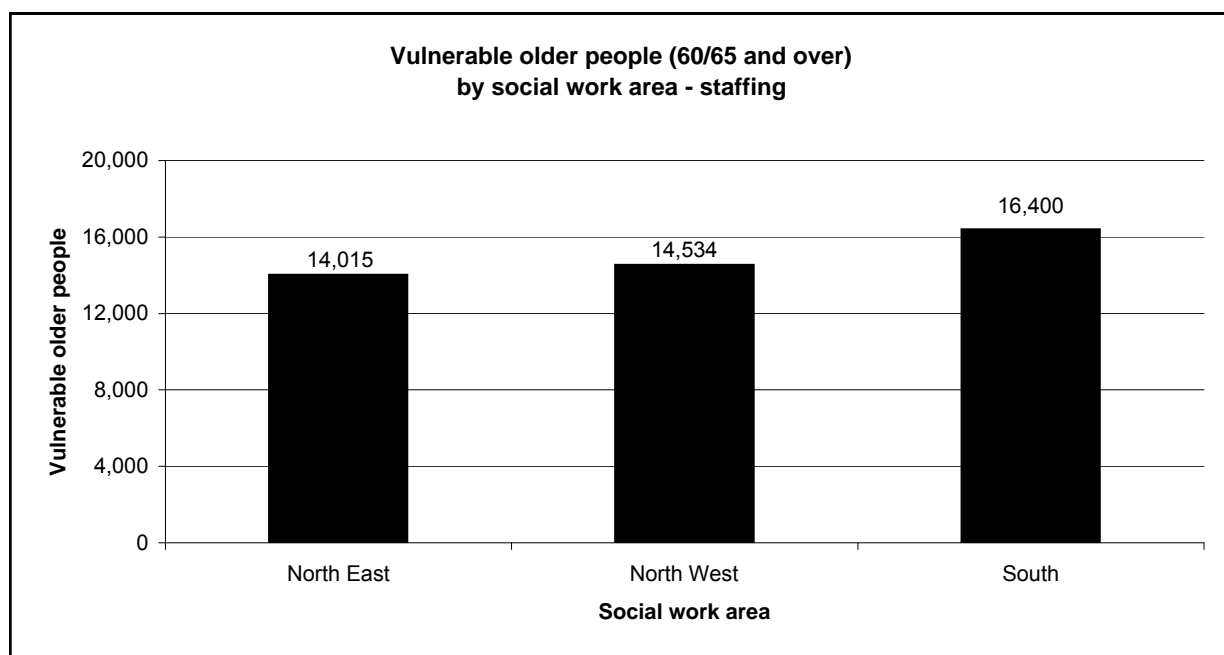
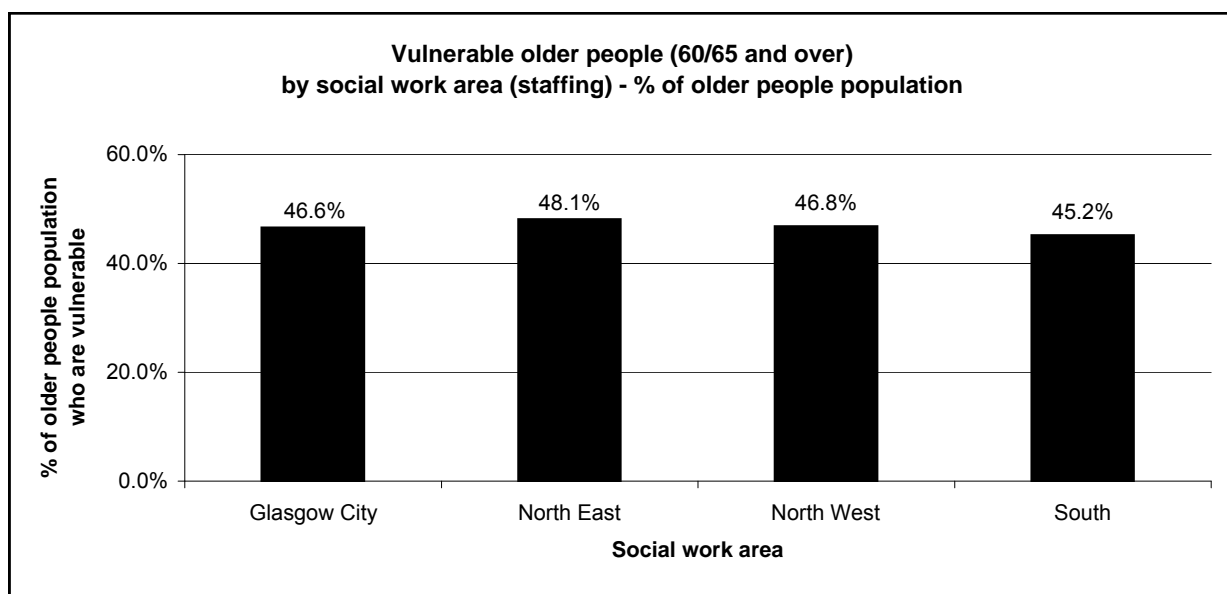


Chart 11.2: Estimates (percentage) of older person (60/65 and over) vulnerability in Glasgow by social work area — for staffing/general budget calculations

Chart 12.1: Estimates (number) of older person (65 and over) vulnerability in Glasgow by social work area — for home care budget calculations

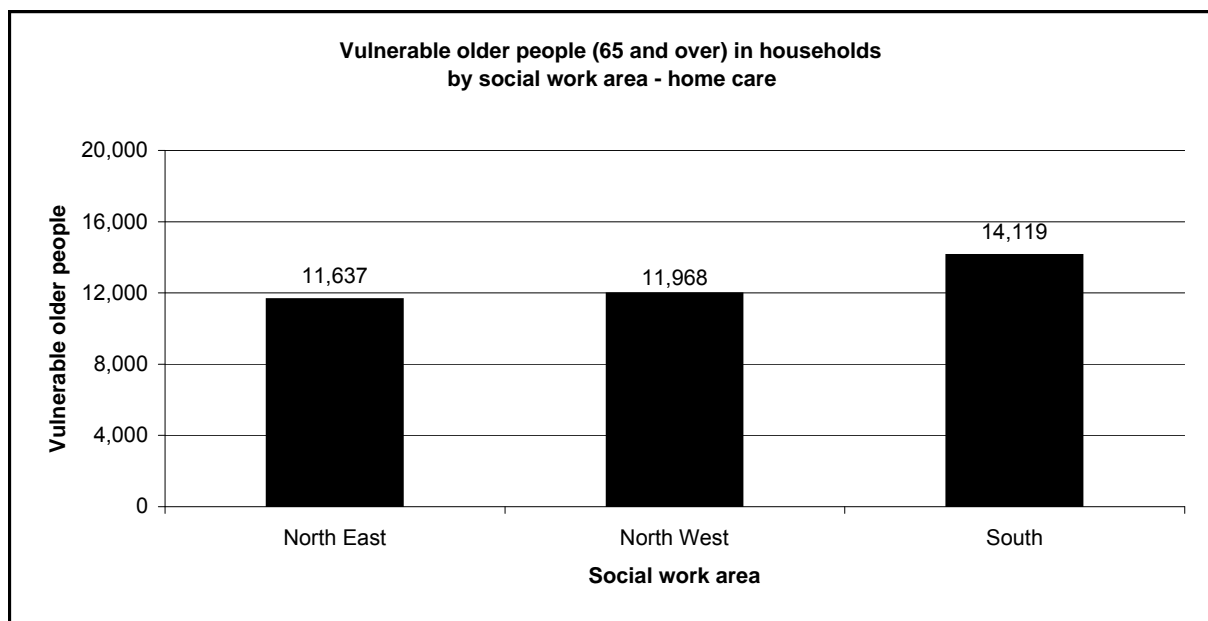
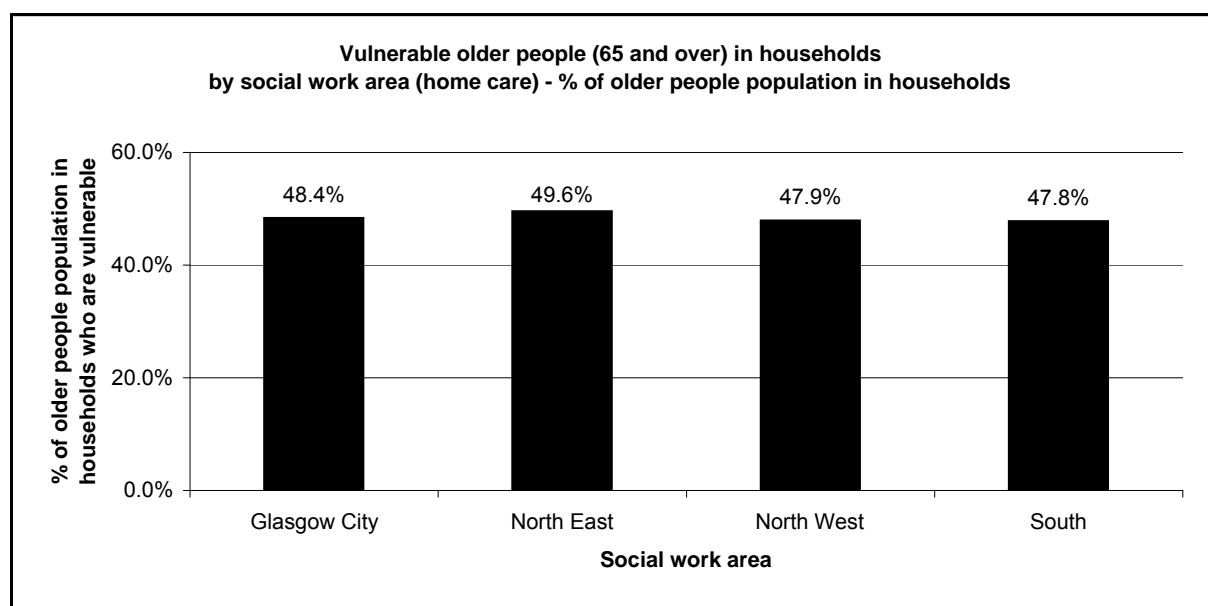


Chart 12.2: Estimates (percentage) of older person (65 and over) vulnerability in Glasgow by social work area — for home care budget calculations

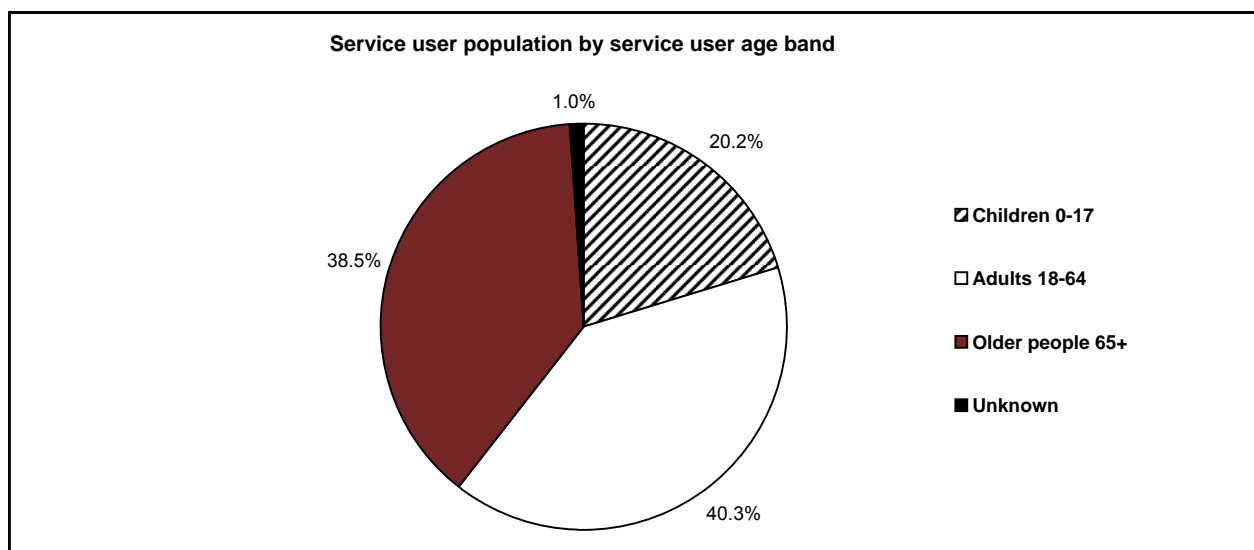

Chart 14.1: Service user population of Glasgow by social work area

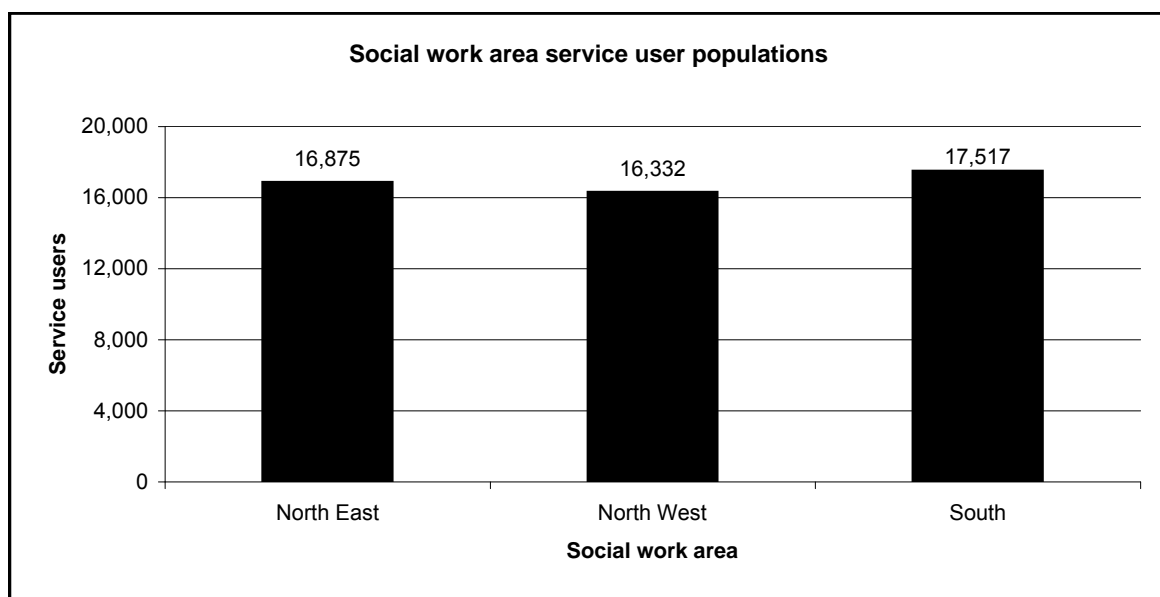
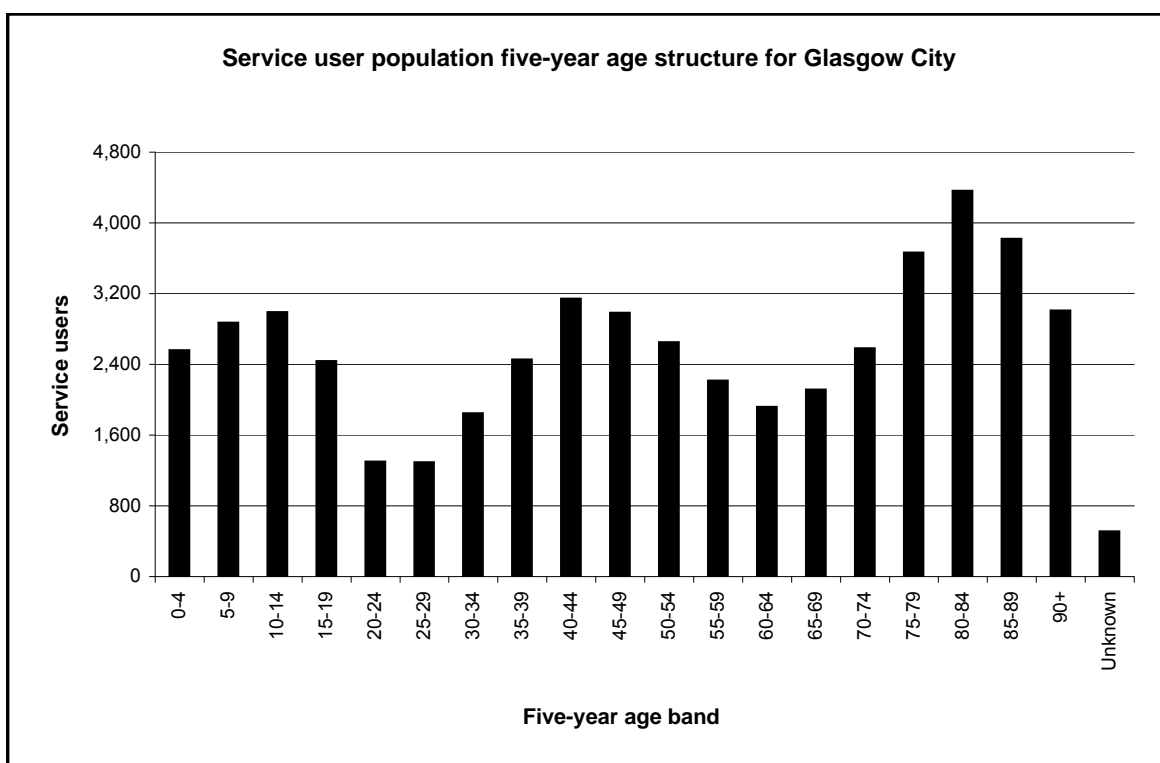


Chart 14.2: Service user population of Glasgow by five-year age band and social work area

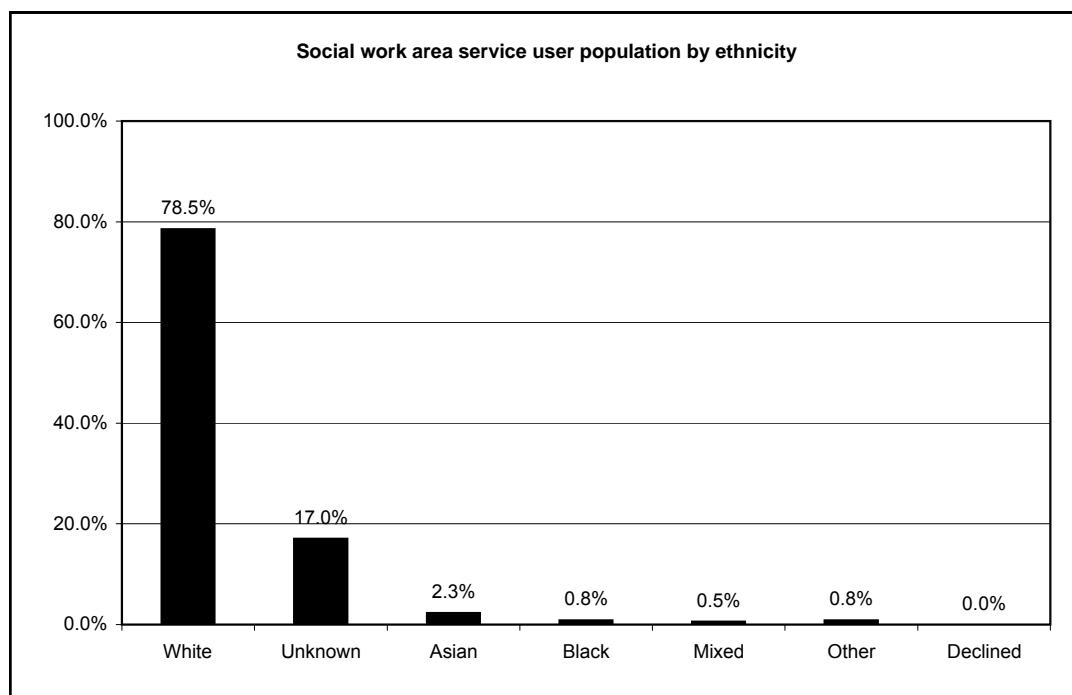

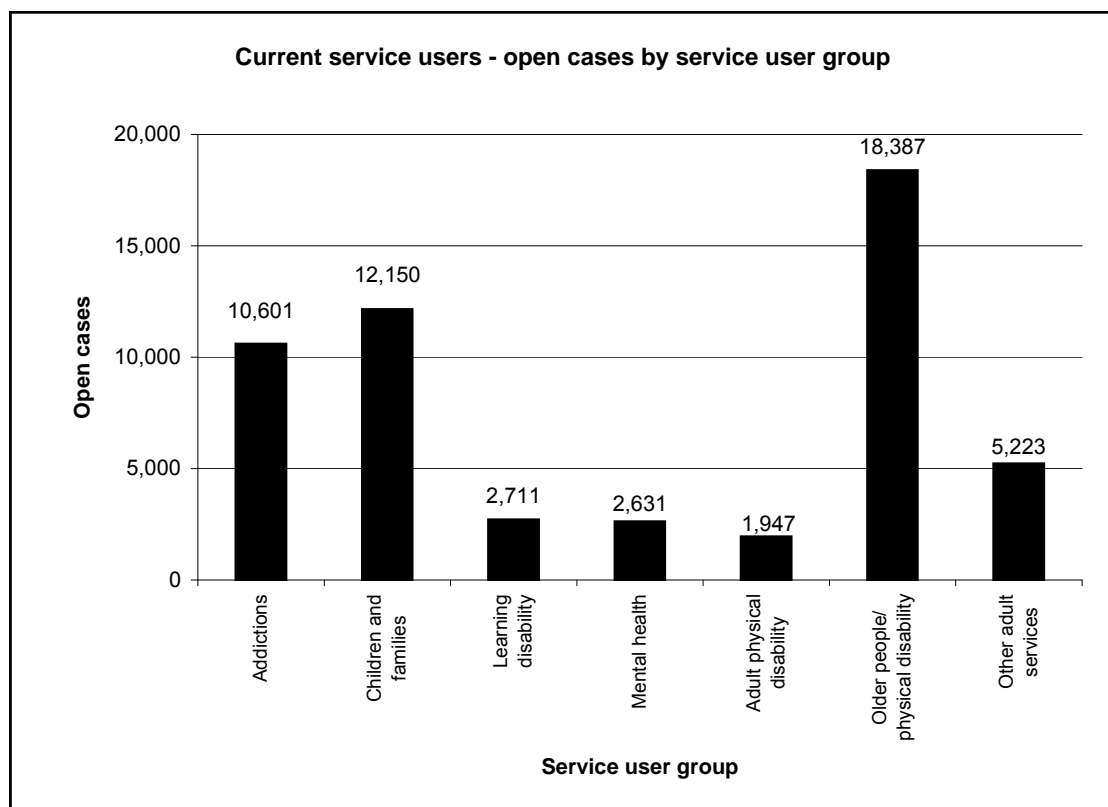

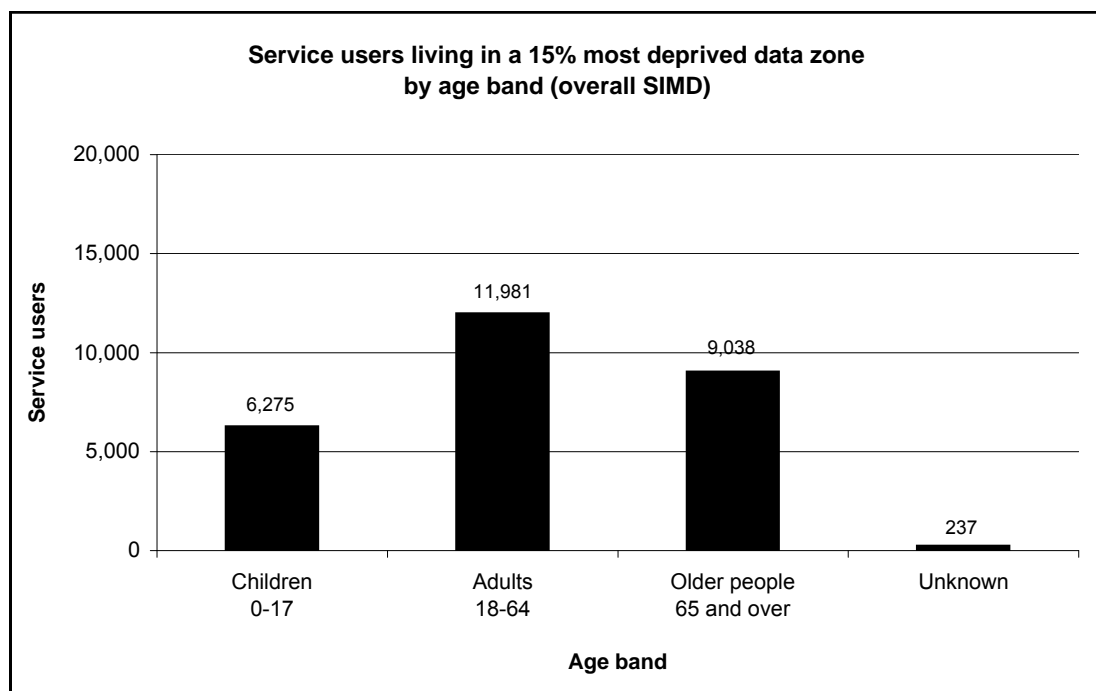

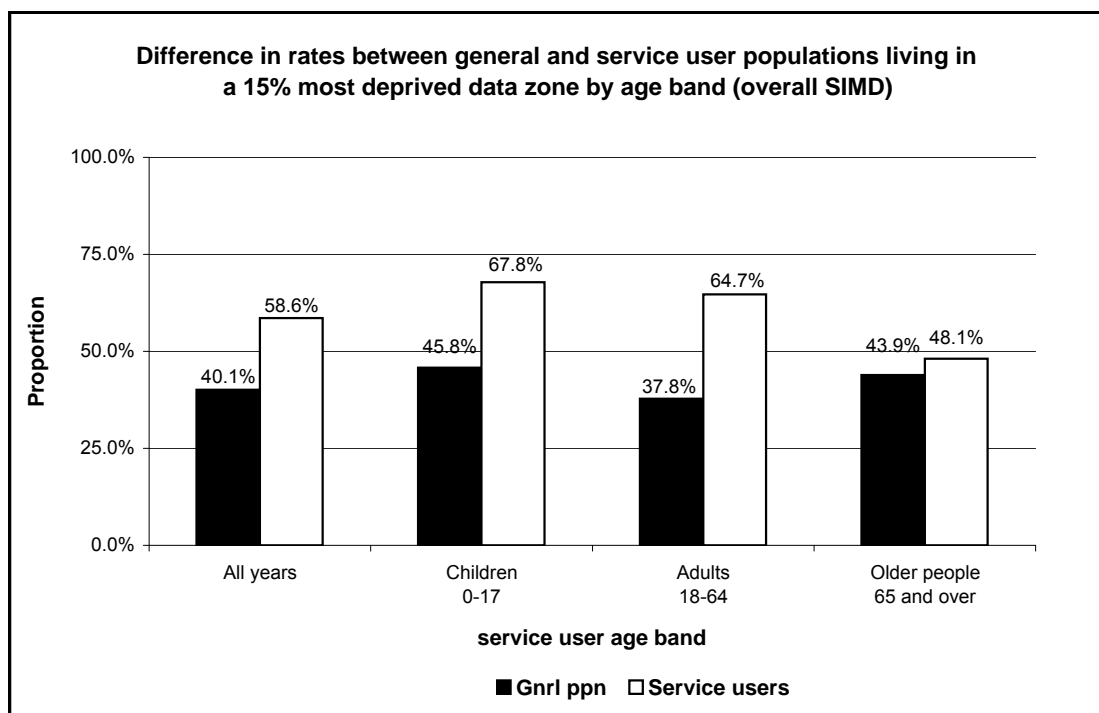

Social Work Area Boundaries (2010) by Glasgow City Multi-member Ward Boundaries

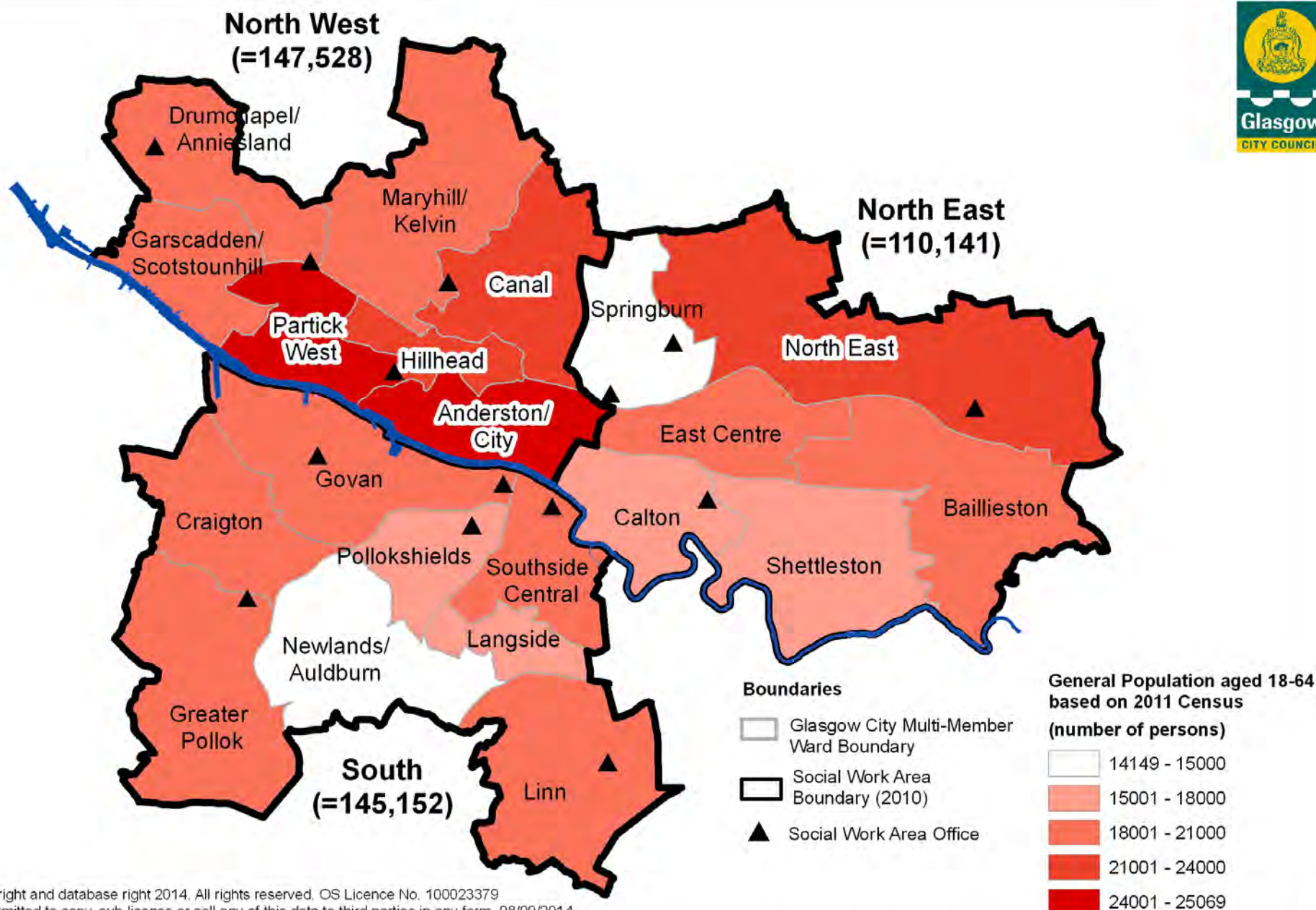
