Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Why should I use the food waste service?

A: Diverting food waste from landfill means it can be recycled and turned into valuable resources such as agricultural fertilisers and energy.

Q: Why should we stop sending food waste to landfill?

A: Landfilling food waste is environmentally unfriendly and an expensive way to dispose of waste. When food waste breaks down in landfill it gives off methane gas, which contributes to climate change and is a waste of a valuable product that can be recycled.

Q: What if I don't produce a lot of food waste?

A: Everyone has food waste – whether it be unavoidable food waste such as tea bags, bones, eggshells or leftovers, even small amounts make a difference when they are recycled.

Food waste recycling is a clean and easy way to get rid of your unavoidable food waste. We all have it, whether it's tea bags, egg shells or banana skins.

You will receive

Indoor caddy



Communal bin to share



A year's supply of compostable liners



Keep your indoor caddy clean

The communal food waste bin will be emptied weekly

How to use your new food waste recycling service

Top tip

To help transport your food waste to the shared bin, keep your tied liner in the caddy then lift it out and place in the shared bin.



1 Put one of the compostable liners into your indoor caddy



2 Transfer any cooked or uncooked food waste to the caddy



3 When the liner is almost full, tie and remove it. Replace with a new liner



4 Place the full liner into the communal food waste bin located outside



5 We will empty the communal food waste bin every week

What happens to the food I recycle?

Your food waste is taken to a special processing plant where it is recycled and turned into valuable resources such as agricultural fertilisers and energy.



Need more liners?

When your initial year's supply of liners has run out you can purchase more from local shops and supermarkets.
