| Dog Fouling | CSG, can issue FPNs (Uniformed and plain clothes Community Enforcement Officers) |

| Mobility Scooter on pavement | Not all pavements are suitable, be aware of blockages too |
| Broken Window | Shop Owner/Police Scotland |
