

The Energy Regulator, Ofgem, estimates electricity and gas theft costs the energy industry in excess of £440 million per annum in the UK. Whilst this is a vast sum and impacts every energy company who are obligated to proactively detect and investigate cases of reported theft, the main issue is the potential safety risk. Energy theft is a criminal act and every electricity or gas tamper carries an inherent safety risk potentially resulting in serious injury or death from electrocution/explosion to the perpetrator, occupants of the property (who are often vulnerable), contractors, neighbouring properties and landlords.

Scottish Power has a full-time dedicated team known as Revenue Protection Services, who investigate all reported cases of energy theft. Acting on reports received from various sources or working in partnership with external agencies (Police, Housing Associations etc), Scottish Power's field engineers will visit residential and commercial properties to carry out a full inspection of the meter and associated If you suspect there is something untoward in regards to the electricity or gas installation at your property or at a neighbouring property, please do not hesitate to contact Scottish Power Revenue Protection Services on

equipment and will remedy the matter and remove the risk. Our engineers will come across some very harrowing cases where there is a substantial risk of fire or explosion and have witnessed severe injuries that have been sustained by parties perpetrating the crime and innocent individuals who have inadvertently came in contact with the illegal supply.
