New Build Broomhill Primary

The newly build Broomhill Primary School will be opened, ahead of schedule, on **Wednesday 24 January 2018.** This is the 44th school to be rebuilt or refurbished in Glasgow in the past ten years.

Thanks to City Building for all their hard work. Did you know, City Building operates the largest construction craft apprenticeship scheme in Scotland? It is also home to RSBi, one of the largest supported manufacturing businesses in Euorpe. RSBi – who constructed all the fittings in this classroom – employs over 250 people, more than half of whom have a disability.

Local elected members were given a preview of the school, and it's looking great! An 'open doors' event is taking place on **Wednesday 17 January, from 12noon to 7pm** – local residents are invited to come along and have a look inside.

"The question you need to ask is, would you let your child cycle ahead of you?"

One of the first emails I received as a new councillor was from Go Bike, the Strathclyde cycle campaign. They were offering to all councillors to take us on a cycle tour of our wards, to highlight the local issues for cyclists. You can see details of all the councillor tours on their website:

Now, I am not a cyclist. So I replied that I would be very happy to do the tour, but it would have to be on foot. But Go Bike had another suggestion...

Going round on the cycle rickshaw gave me a cyclist's eye view of my ward. My tour guides pointed out to me some of the problems that cyclists face:

- Cars parked on cycle lanes
- Faded or missing signs, making it hard to follow cycle routes
- Driving into bike zones at lights
- Poor lighting on cycle routes

It's not all bad news – we went past St Paul's Primary, where the pavement outside the school has been widened, to encourage children to cycle to school. Last year St Paul's was awarded a Cycle Friendly Primary School award, for its work promoting cycling for pupils, teachers and parents.

In order to cut emissions and improve health, rates of active travel across the city need to rise. A key part of this is developing cycle routes across the city.

Most people use different modes of transport at different times. Roads and pavements should be able to be shared safely between drivers, cyclists and pedestrians. As my tour guide said, they should be safe enough for a child to use.
