I would like to thank Broomhill residents for the opportunity to serve them at Glasgow City Council. Since then, it has been a privilege to get to know residents, community leaders and various stakeholders.

As one of your local councillors, I am aware of the various ongoing issues which affect the area including: parking problems, general bin uplift, dangerous pavement condition and residents' personal issues. With the help of the appropriate authorities and major community groups, work has been undertaken to resolve some of these issues but there are many issues still needing to be resolved in 2018.

The challenges associated with the opening of the new Broomhill primary is one such issue, although it was exciting to have been part of the process involved in the redevelopment of the school. Broomhill Primary School Parent Council, officers from the Council and myself met to discuss both its completion and associated challenges, and I also visited the site during construction.

Now that a move-in date has been set with the school opening to parents on 17th January, 2018, ensuring a quick resolution of the proposed "Traffic Regulation Order" for the area is utmost on my mind. The opening of the school has raised questions about how traffic will be managed, particularly during drop-off and pick-up periods. I know this is a major source of concern to residents. The proposed traffic regulation order as initiated by the council seeks to make Edgehill road one way from Woodcroft Avenue to Beechwood Drive. As one of your local councillors, I will be working with the council, community groups and Broomhill residents to ensure that all concerns are taken into account before and when implementing any traffic regulation order.

Besides the above ongoing issue, I ensured that residents views were taken into account during the construction of the new atrium building.

I also worked with prospective tenants to represent their views and took particular interest in ensuring that parking measures for the development was adequate. Now, additional pressure from parking on Broomhill drive would be avoided. I know this is crucial due to the precarious nature of the bend on Broomhill drive.

I have since then been working on other issues affecting Broomhill.

As recently as last December and in January, 2018, I went on a walk about with community representatives and a council officer to discuss and proffer solutions to other issues that have been raised by residents.

Although the year ahead is filled with challenges, it is worth mentioning a couple of events which were held in December.

Firstly, I had the pleasure of meeting some of our local Constituents at the Glasgow City Council Senior Citizens Lunch hosted in the City Chambers by the Lord Provost.
