MEMBERS' REPORT

For the 15 month period ended 31 March 2018

The members present their report on the affairs of the Limited Liability Partnership, together with the audited financial statements for the 15 month period ended 31 March 2018.

Service Glasgow LLP, trading as "ACCESS", ("the LLP") is a Limited Liability Partnership registered in Scotland with registered number SO301705.

Principal Activity

During the period ended 31 March 2018, the LLP was principally engaged in the provision of Information and Communications Technology ("ICT"), Property related and Facility Management services in the UK. The Members have separately considered the status of the Service Agreement with Glasgow City Council which expired on 31 March 2018. As the Service Agreement underpins the Service Glasgow statutory entity and the members have not acquired a replacement trade and do not intend to acquire a replacement trade it is the intention of the Members to wind up the LLP after 31 March 2018, following the settlement of the remaining net assets. On this basis the members have not prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis. The effect of this is explained in note 2.

Change of Financial Period End

The accounting reference date of the LLP was changed from 31 December to 31 March to run coterminous with the year end of its ultimate controlling party at the period end, Glasgow City Council. Accordingly, the current financial statements are prepared for the 15 months from 1 January 2017 to 31 March 2018 and as a result, the comparative figures stated in the income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity, cash flow statement and the related notes are not comparable.

Business Review

The results for the period ended 31 March 2018 are set out on page 8. The members regard these results as satisfactory and believe they reflect the level of activity during the year. The LLP's primary contract for the provision of ICT and Property Services to Glasgow City Council was awarded in 2008. The service provision was extended throughout 2011-2012 to include ICT and Property Services to the Education estate, additional Glasgow City Council Properties and Jobs and Business Glasgow. Following the completion of contract on 31 March 2018 the LLP has ceased trading.

Key Performance Indicators ("KPIs")

Performance is monitored by management in line with the LLP's strategy and with reference to a number of KPIs. In 2017/18, the LLP handled 224,008 incidents and service requests which were logged through the Service Desk (2016: 210,453). A Customer Satisfaction Service Level Agreement ("SLA") was introduced in October 2008; the reported measure for the 12 month period ended 31 December 2017 was 94.68% against a target of 85% (year ended 31 December 2016: 91% against a target of 85%). Due to the contract terminating on 31 March 2018 an SLA waiver was enacted from 1 February 2018 through to the end of the contract to reflect the transition of service to the new service provider.

The LLP has continued to perform well against contracted Service Level Agreements ("SLAs") during the final period of operation. In total 323 SLAs were applied to ICT services (2016: 324), 26 SLAs were applied to management services (2016: 28), and 4 SLAs are applied to property services (2016: 4) until 31 January 2018 when the SLA waiver was in place.

Financial Risk Management Objectives and Policies

The LLP is principally funded through management of its working capital.

The main risks arising from the LLP's financial instruments are liquidity risk and credit risk. The Partnership Board reviews and agrees policies for managing each of these risks and these are summarised below. The LLP does not enter into derivative transactions.

Liquidity Risk

The LLP's objective is to maintain a balance between continuity of funding and flexibility through the use of working capital and members' loans.

Credit Risk

The LLP's principal financial assets are cash and cash equivalents and amounts due from members.

The LLP trades with only its designated members and recognised, creditworthy third parties. It is the LLP's policy that as may be deemed appropriate, clients are subject to credit vetting procedures. The LLP has one public sector customer.

Designated Members

The designated members at the date of this report are Glasgow City Council and GCC LLP Investments Limited. GCC Investments Limited was admitted as a member of Service Glasgow LLP on 30 November 2017. Serco Limited ceased to be a member of Service Glasgow LLP on 30 November 2017.

The designated members each own 50% of the LLP however the voting rights are held by Glasgow City Council (99,999 votes) and GCC LLP Investments Limited (1 vote).

Policy regarding Members' Drawings and Capital

The level and timing of drawings is decided by the LLP's Operating Board after taking into account the LLP's cash requirements for operating and investment activities. Unallocated profits and losses are shown in "Other Reserves". The level of members' capital is determined by the members in accordance with the members' agreement.

Equal Opportunities Policy

It is the policy of the LLP to provide equal opportunities in all areas of its employment including recruitment, education, training, promotion, transfer and terms and conditions of employment.

There shall be no discrimination on the grounds of colour, race, nationality, ethnic or national origin, religion, social background, marital status, sex, sexuality, actual or perceived AIDS/HIV status or perceived association with an HIV positive person, age or disability. This policy applies to all departments and to all grades and positions.

All employees will be recruited, trained and promoted on the basis of ability, job requirements and fitness for work.

Where appropriate as determined by monitoring procedures, lawful positive action, training and encouragement will be considered in areas where particular groups are under-represented to make this policy fully effective.

This policy is in accordance with relevant legislation.

Employee Consultation

The LLP places considerable value on the involvement of its employees and ensures that they are fully integrated within its activities. This is achieved through:

- Regular briefings and a newsletter highlighting the LLP's strategy, performance and market successes;
- Training and development programmes for employees designed to ensure employees' continuing professional and personal development is in a manner aligned with the LLP's business needs; and
- Employee surveys.

Supplier Payment Policy

The LLP seeks to agree commercial payment terms with its suppliers and, provided performance is in accordance with the agreed terms, to make payment accordingly.

Statement of Members' Responsibilities in Respect of the Members' Report and the financial statements

The members are responsible for preparing the Members' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

The Limited Liability Partnerships (Accounts and Audit) (Application of Companies Act 2006) Regulations 2008 require the members to prepare financial statements for each financial period. Under that law the members have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with IFRSs as adopted by the EU and applicable law.

Under Regulation 8 of the Limited Liability Partnerships (Accounts and Audit) (Application of Companies Act 2006) Regulations 2008 the members must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the LLP and of its profit or loss for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the members are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether they have been prepared in accordance with IFRSs as adopted by the EU;
- assess the LLP's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern; and
- use the going concern basis of accounting unless they either intend to liquidate the LLP or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so (as explained in note 2, the directors do not believe that it is appropriate to prepare these financial statements on a going concern basis).

Under Regulation 6 of the Limited Liability Partnerships (Accounts and Audit) (Application of Companies Act 2006) Regulations 2008, the members are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the LLP's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the LLP and enable them to ensure that its financial statements comply with those regulations. Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Service Glasgow LLP ("the LLP") for the 15 month period ended 31 March 2018 which comprise the Income Statement, the Balance Sheet, Statement of Changes in Equity, the Cash Flow Statement and the related notes. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) as adopted by the EU. These financial statements have not been prepared on the going concern basis for the reason set out in note 2.

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view, of the state of affairs of the LLP as at 31 March 2018 and of its profit for the period then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the EU; and
- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006 as applied to limited liability partnerships by the Limited Liability Partnerships (Accounts and Audit) (Application of Companies Act 2006) Regulations 2008.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK) ("ISAs (UK)") and applicable law. Our responsibilities are described below. We have fulfilled our ethical responsibilities under, and are independent of the LLP in accordance with, UK ethical requirements including the FRC Ethical Standard. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is a sufficient and appropriate basis for our opinion.

Other information

The members are responsible for the other information, which comprises the members' report. Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and, accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion or any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Service Glasgow LLP ("the LLP") is a limited liability partnership incorporated in Scotland under the Limited Liability Partnerships Act 2000. The address of its registered office is 220 High Street, Glasgow, G4 0QW. The registered number SO301705.

The LLP was incorporated on 28 January 2008 and, on 1 April 2008, assumed responsibility for the ICT and Property Management Services of Glasgow City Council, contracted until 31 March 2018. In 2011, these services were extended to include provision of ICT managed services to the Education Secondary Schools in Glasgow City Council. 2012 saw the extension of services through the provision of ICT managed services to Glasgow Regeneration Agency and to the Education Pre-12 and Assisted Support for Learning schools, Property managed services to the Education estate of Glasgow City Council and Facilities management services to the remaining Glasgow City Council city centre properties.

These financial statements are presented in pounds sterling because that is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the LLP operates.

There are no new standards, amendments or interpretations that are effective for the first time for the current financial period that have a material impact on the LLP.

Given the intention of the Members to wind up the LLP, no new accounting standards are expected to have an impact on the financial statements of the LLP in future periods.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) as adopted by the European Union and under the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

Going concern

On 31 March 2018 the members took the decision to cease trading following expiration of the Service Agreement underpinning the Service Glasgow LLP. Accordingly the members have not prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis. The financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2016 were prepared on a non-going concern basis to reflect the end of the contract at 31 March 2018. The financial position of the LLP is shown on the balance sheet on page 9. It is the intention of the Members that the LLP will be wound up in a controlled manner following the settlement of all outstanding liabilities.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and represents amounts receivable for goods and services provided in the normal course of business, net of discounts and VAT.

Intangible assets

An internally-generated intangible asset arising from the LLP's development is recognised only if all of the following conditions are met:

- an asset is created that can be identified;
- it is probable that the asset created will generate future income benefits; and
- the development cost of the asset can be measured reliably.

Internally-generated intangible assets are amortised over the remaining life of the LLP's main contract. Where no internally-generated intangible asset can be recognised, development expenditure is recognised as an expense in the period in which it is incurred. Amortisation is provided over the useful life which is expected to end on 31 March 2018.

Leasing

Leases are classified as finance leases whenever the terms of the lease transfer substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership to the lessee. All other leases are classified as operating leases.

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged to the income statement on a straight-line basis over the term of the relevant lease.

Members' remuneration

Remuneration to members that is paid under the LLP agreement, or other payments, which represent a liability of Service Glasgow LLP not arising from a division of profits, are expensed to the income statement and disclosed within note 13.

Profit shares which have not been allocated at the balance sheet date are treated in these financial statements as unallocated at the balance sheet date and included within other reserves.

Retirement benefit costs

Payments to defined contribution retirement benefit schemes are charged as an expense as they fall due. Payments made to state-managed retirement benefit schemes are dealt with as payments to defined contribution schemes where the LLP's obligations under the scheme are equivalent to those arising in a defined contribution retirement benefit scheme.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and demand deposits that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised on the LLP's balance sheet when the LLP becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Trade receivables

Trade receivable amounts due from members and cash and cash equivalents are classified as "loans and receivables". They do not carry any interest and are stated at their nominal value as reduced by appropriate allowances for estimated irrecoverable amounts.

Trade payables

Trade payables and amounts due to members are classified as "other financial liabilities". They are not interest bearing and are stated at their nominal value.

Financial Assets

All financial assets are recognised and derecognised on a trade date where the purchase or sale of a financial asset is under a contract whose terms require delivery of the financial asset within the timeframe established by the LLP's principal customer, and are initially measured at fair value, plus transaction costs, except for those financial assets classified as at fair value through the profit or loss, which are initially measured at fair value.

Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value and principally comprise work in progress which represents employee time on projects that are incomplete and includes expenditure and other costs in bringing the projects to their existing status.

Taxation

The taxation payable on profits of the Limited Liability Partnership is the liability of the members. Accordingly, no tax charge is included in the income statement.

3. REVENUE

The revenue of the LLP is principally derived from the provision of ICT and property related services to Glasgow City Council and arises solely in the United Kingdom.
