Regulation 5 specifies how the proposals are publicised. This is where traffic orders enter the public domain. This regulation states that an order must be advertised in a local newspaper by way of a notice containing the particulars of that order and provide a copy of the documents for public perusal. Also stated in the regulation are steps that may be undertaken in addition to the minimum requirements as to extend publicity e.g. display of notices in roads or other paces affected by the order. Over 1200 notices were displayed throughout the area from 28 April until 25 May 2018.

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



Regulation 5 specifies how the proposals are publicised. This is where traffic orders enter the public domain. This regulation states that an order must be advertised in a local newspaper by way of a notice containing the particulars of that order and provide a copy of the documents for public perusal. Also stated in the regulation are steps that may be undertaken in addition to the minimum requirements as to extend publicity e.g. display of notices in roads or other paces affected by the order. Over 1200 notices were displayed throughout the area from 28 April until 25 May 2018.

There is no statutory requirement to inform the public of traffic regulation order proposals prior to the Publication of Proposals stage of the process, however Rangers Football Club were specifically written to in January 2017 and then again in November 2017 to advise of the Council's intentions.


