he £10 charge for a 10 year resident's visitor parking permit is an administration fee to contribute towards the processing of the application. Please note that these permits are only required for vehicles visiting residential properties within the zone during operational hours and additional permits can be applied for when necessary, even if the scheme is already in operation.

Any vehicle contravening the parking restrictions in place would be liable to receive a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) and may be uplifted.

I would be obliged if you could confirm which lanes you refer to so this can be investigated.

I can advise that reviewing parking controls after they are implemented consists of analysing any feedback received following their introduction. There is no specific consultation or engagement with the local community as that is currently being carried out as part of the statutory process.

I can confirm that any discussions to re-open Ibrox train station are not part of these proposals and any facility to allow ticket holders to use public transport free of charge would need to be discussed and agreed between the football club and public transport provider directly. I am writing, as a frequent attendee at football matches at Ibrox Stadium using private transport, to register my concerns about the proposed parking restrictions around the stadium.

Whilst I understand the wishes of residents in surrounding areas to have normality in their environs during matchdays, the planned restrictions are outrageously restrictive for the football fan wishing to travel to the match. Areas which are a 20 minute walk from the stadium are being closed off to parking for supporters which in my opinion is extreme.

Most importantly in my opinion, whilst GCC seek to restrict private transport to events at Ibrox Stadium, the proposed plan in no way compensates the supporter with an alternative mode of transport. Public transport to the stadium from all directions is already inadequate and there have been no proposals put forward to improve public transport links to mitigate against the increased usage caused by the car parking restrictions.

I am writing to register my objection to the proposal to restrict car owners from parking in the vicinity of Ibrox Stadium and surrounding areas.

I regularly travel by car to Ibrox on match days with my elderly husband and we rely on being able to park in the area. We are not Blue Badge holders nor members of a supporters bus. Parking in means we still have to face a good 20-25 minute walk which can be very unpleasant in inclement weather.

The lack of good transport links in very close proximity to the stadium is sadly lacking for the vast majority of the travelling support. Bus services are erratic and run to their own schedule, the subway cannot cope as it is and there is no rail link.

We have tried using public transport on several occasions this year to test your proposals and it has been extremely unsatisfactory. We have discovered that some scheduled buses just don't turn up. One extremely cold day after a match, saw several of us waiting at the bus stop on for around 80 minutes with no bus shelter for protection! This is not an unusual occurrence where First Bus are concerned and this is what happens when the minority of the support are using public transport. I dread to think what it would be like if the majority were forced into using a bus or subway service as things stand at present. In my opinion the system would be unable to cope. Many fans already leave the stadium a good 10-15 minutes early in order to queue at the subway and still face lengthy waits. There appears to be no evidence that transport links would be vastly improved in the Ibrox area or the city to accommodate a huge increase in travelling fans.

As much as I can understand that residents do not like outsiders coming to park in their streets, it is probably an inconvenience for 3 hours maximum every second week. I have never witnessed any raucous behaviour from our fans as they make their way back to their cars. They walk quietly and take care not to block people's driveways. In the area the residents do not park on the street as they have their own driveways so I cannot see what harm is being done by fans using the street spaces. Your proposal to push fans farther out is only going to move the parking issue into other areas which are predominantly residential areas where residents only have street parking. This could cause feelings of animosity towards fans taking the spaces.

Ibrox Stadium is a major attraction and a wealthy source of revenue to the Ibrox area yet it seems the fans are being targeted for just wanting to follow their team.

This unfairness seems to be highlighted by the fact that events in Bellhouston Park will not be affected by this proposal yet I know of friends who find life intolerable when concerts are on, due to the behaviour and noise of the revellers.

I would urge you to rethink this proposal until our public transport system is definitely able to support the migration of 40000+ fans who would have to rely on using it to get close to the stadium. It is disgraceful that our Council expects its citizens of all ages to walk over a mile to and from the match in the weather we experience in Scotland. I think the number of streets earmarked in the zone is excessive.

I can advise that, by the introduction of Event Day Parking Zones, attendees should be encouraged to use public transport for all or part of their journey to stadia in Glasgow. Furthermore, my Officers have met with SPT, Scotrail and bus operators to establish the current levels of service and discuss possible improvements to public transport. Bus operators have noted that no real improvement can be made due to the volume of traffic in the area both prior to and after a game. They would be happy to review this but only when there is less traffic in the area. SPT also noted that Shields Road Park and Ride had capacity to be utilised further on match days.

In addition to the above, supporter's buses would be accommodated within the zone. The locations for dedicated supporter bus parking have been agreed with Police Scotland as they manage this facility on match days. If, in the future, there appears to be insufficient accommodation for the number of supporter buses parking in the area then the Council, in conjunction with Police Scotland, can look to provide additional locations where practicable.

I can advise that there is no evidence to suggest that the introduction of parking controls will have a detrimental effect on the area, in contrast those using public transport may be more likely to spend time in the area and add to the local economy than those bringing their private car.
