
I am a resident of a second and in support of the implementation of the Event Day Zone Parking scheme in this area.

As a resident of **the second**, I am writing to support the introduction of parking controls in the area for Ibrox match days.

I live on which is less than a 10 minute walk to the stadium and on match days our street is extremely congested.

Cars park opposite our driveway which makes it very difficult to exit and enter the driveway to my property. In addition, with cars parked on one side along the full length of our street, the street is reduced to a single lane. If there is an oncoming vehicle, one of the vehicles has to either reverse back down the street, mount the pavement or pull into a driveway to allow the approaching vehicle to pass.


Cars tend to arrive in the area up to 2 hours before a match. The occupants will sit in their cars eating, drinking and smoking, discarding their wrappers, burger boxes, drinks cans, beer and Buckfast bottles etc.







All permits being displayed on vehicles will be marked with a hologram to prevent forgery and any suspected fraudulent use of permits can be reported to the Council which my enforcement team can investigate.

I can confirm that my enforcement team carry out patrols around Ibrox Stadium during football games / major events and do Issue Penalty Charge Notices (PCN's) to vehicles in contravention of the restrictions.

Enforcement is carried out in conjunction with Police Scotland using pre-agreed routes. Each road in the area is visited and enforced as required. Vehicle removals on the routes designated as emergency routes get priority over non-emergency routes. If vehicles are parked on emergency routes they will be issued with a PCN and removed. If a vehicle is parked in residential area they will only be issued with a PCN. They will not be removed.



Carte Blanche issuing on this matter cannot be undertaken, and rigorous checks must be done to ensure that they are truly required, if not then we will only be faced with the status quo we have at this moment.

My 3rd is enforcement. At the moment enforcement only seems to be concentrated on the emergency routes, which is understandable, but it sadly neglects the areas blighted by parking. Enforcement must be a priority for this new system.

I can advise that restricting permits to a specific area was not part of the original proposals that were publicised and I am unable to consider this at this stage of the statutory process.

I can confirm that permits would have a unique reference number that is stored on a database that can be searched if required. Permits can also be revoked if there is any misuse, the 10-year residents' visitor permit is in line with all other similar schemes operating in Glasgow and I am unable to change its inclusion within these proposals at this stage of the statutory process.

Feedback from the local community and my enforcement team will identify any issues if this scheme is implemented.

I am a resident of sections and I am, in principle, in support of the EDZP scheme. However, I think that it's implementation has been poorly thought through and I have the following concerns -

1. There is no limit to the number of visitors' permits that a resident can obtain

- 2. There does not appear to be a limit on the number of permits that businesses and organisations can obtain. So potentially people could join an organisation simply to obtain a permit. Clearly this is open to abuse.
- 3. The visitors permits appear to be general permits rather limited to an area. So someone could obtain a permit from a resident in one part of Ibrox and park in a completely different part of Ibrox. This would make it very difficult to identify if the scheme is being abused. Permits should be clearly marked with the street where the resident lives. Will this be done?
- 4. The website Q and A states that, regards visitors' permits, "A resident can purchase as many as they require at a cost of £10 per permit, however this will be closely monitored to ensure there is no abuse of the system". How will the council monitor for abuse and what sanctions will they take against anyone abusing the system. Will each visitor permit have the name and address or a code to identify which resident bought the permit? Will a database be maintained of which residents have bought permits and how many?
- 5. The visitor permits are valid for 10 years. If the EDZP scheme actually makes parking worse, people with visitor permits will be able to continue parking for the next 10 years and there will be nothing that the residents or council can do. The council should issue visitor permits that are only valid for at most 1 year until the scheme has been thoroughly tested and proven to be effective.
- 6. There is no indication of how the council will monitor the scheme to assess whether it improves or worsens the parking situation.





I can advise that residents may apply for a residents parking permit, free of charge, for any vehicle they have registered at their address. Residents' visitor parking permits can be purchased by residents within the affected area at a cost of £10 for 10 years.

I can advise that, by the introduction of Event Day Parking Zones, attendees should be encouraged to use public transport for all or part of their journey to stadia in Glasgow. Furthermore, my Officers have met with SPT, Scotrail and bus operators to establish the current levels of service and discuss possible improvements to public transport. Bus operators have noted that no real improvement can be made due to the volume of traffic in the area both prior to and after a game. They would be happy to review this but only when there is less traffic in the area. SPT also noted that Shields Road Park and Ride had capacity to be utilised further on match days.

In addition to the above, supporter's buses would be accommodated within the zone. The locations for dedicated supporter bus parking have been agreed with Police Scotland as they manage this facility on match days. If, in the future, there appears to be insufficient accommodation for the number of supporter buses parking in the area then the Council, in conjunction with Police Scotland, can look to provide additional locations where practicable.



My name is and I live at a sea. This is an area covered by the proposed Ibrox event day parking scheme. I want this scheme to go ahead as it is necessary for the welfare and amenity of local residents. The impact of a significant influx of cars on myself and neighbours is intolerable.

I have lived in this area for 19 years and the street is mainly quiet. It is very easy to park at or near my house at any time apart from when there is an event at Ibrox or the occasional very big event in Bellahouston Park. I know that I don't have a right to park outside my house, but I should not be inconvenienced by someone from Perth or Ayr using my area as a convenient place to abandon their transport for a few hours on a Saturday or a Sunday. This is important to me as I suffer from Unfortunately during the football season, I am either trapped at my home or away from home during home games and 1-2 hours on either side of these events. Every square inch of parking space is filled up and if you need to make a short trip anywhere in the vicinity it is impossible to find a parking space on your return. I need to check the football fixtures in order to be aware if I can travel by car from my home during match days. What is particularly difficult is that matches occur at different times over the weekend. With the parking being reserved for residents, I could be assured that on my return I can get parked.

Parking is not the only issue. People don't arrive at the same time, so there is no great problem of traffic congestion at that point. The real problem is when the game finishes and drivers try to leave at around the same time. This causes huge congestion and it can take up to an hour for traffic to clear. I really don't want

to breathe in the emissions from so many cars idling their engines outside my home. This is a city that is discussing low emission zones.

I would not be surprised if fan groups that support those who regularly travel to Ibrox by car get together and deluge you with objections to the scheme. That is the right of anyone, but I would point out that most of these people don't live here. Why should someone from Cowdenbeath who has been urged to write in be listened to over people who live or work in and the other areas covered by the scheme. Note that these people may even be armchair fans who don't often come to Glasgow. I could understand if Ibrox was a hard place to get to, but there are frequent buses on Paisley Road West and there is a subway stop at Ibrox. There are also fan buses that have other parking areas designated to them.

Finally, I should point out that there are a number of similar schemes operating in Glasgow and they work very well. Please give the people surrounding Ibrox the benefit of having \similar scheme in place.

From a wider perspective, is a family orientated area, with the abundance of social spaces providing opportunities for families to enjoy some quality time together at weekends. Currently, these opportunities are adversely affected by the influx of Rangers supporters and their vehicles. It is not an exaggeration to say that this can be quite intimidating to residents, particularly when young children are

involved. I would urge the council to consider the wider environmental impact on the area of the current situation. It cannot be acceptable to perpetuate conditions which adversely affect local residents and their environment on the basis that any change would be inconvenient for a number of football club supporters.

I trust that the above is clear but should you wish to discuss any matter in greater detail, please do not hesitate to contact me.





I write to confirm my support of the proposed "THE GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL (IBROX STADIUM) (EVENT DAY EMERGENCY ROUTES AND PARKING CONTROLS) ORDER 201_"

There are a number of reasons I wish to support this order which include:-

- The present arrangements for the management and control of Parking when large events are held in the area particularly in relation to those occasions when a match or other event is taking place at lbrox Stadium simply are insufficient, do not 'work', no doubt are costly to administer and are very difficult, if not practically impossible, to enforce.
- Whilst no 'system' is likely to be 'perfect' what is planned, it seems to me, will be much better than what we have at the moment.
- I am advised similar systems in the Scotstoun and Hampden areas of Glasgow;
 and in Murrayfield area of Edinburgh apparently work well.
- The scheme has the support of the two Community Councils which cover the portion of my Ward included.
- My constituents advise me that it was in January 2017 that they were 'promised' that such a scheme would be 'in place' and operational by August/September of that year.
- Local MSP — advises me that she was 'promised' that the introduction of such a scheme would be put in place as a 'legacy' after the 2014 Commonwealth Games and that she is concerned that there should be no further delay.

It appears that whilst the vast majority of my Constituents are supportive of the scheme – even some who are supportive - do have legitimate and understandable concerns which have been drawn to my attention:-

Those concerns relate principally to issues concerning permits and permit holders.

1. Constituents are concerned that the number of Permits issued to any resident, business, club, association, faith or voluntary group, situated within the area of the Zone, will be modest, reasonable, proportionate and will be

monitored and reviewed by the Department – with appropriate remedial action being taken if any misuse is found to occur.


- 2. Arising therefore from 1, above it is requested and suggested that Permits have a 'code number' (and perhaps also a Postal Code) so that should misuse of a Permit be experienced action the more easily will be able to be taken.
- 3. I fully endorse the suggestion of each Permit having a code number or other means of identification and would request that this please be done.

Finally I would confirm that recently I suggested to the football Club, football Club, that it would be helpful - in all events — whether under the present unsatisfactory parking arrangements — or under a new scheme — for his Club to seek to introduce an arrangement for 'Free Public Transport' on Match Days for supporters/customers having a Ticket to attend - i.e. 'automatic' — if you have a match ticket Public Transport for you is free that day.

Thank you for your correspondence regarding the above named Traffic Regulation Order.

These parking controls are designed to allow the local community to operate as normal, without the negative influence of event day parking, therefore organisations including churches, local businesses and community clubs would be able to apply for the amount of parking permits they require free of charge. All applications for permits will be decided and monitored by the Council's Customer and Business Services team, any unusual activity or irregularities will be reported for an investigation to be carried out.

All permits being displayed on vehicles will be marked with a hologram to prevent forgery and any suspected fraudulent use of permits can be reported to the Council which my enforcement team can investigate.

I can confirm that, in line with the background for these proposals and the contents of the Traffic Regulation Order, these proposals are only for events being held at Ibrox Stadium. The control of traffic for events in Bellahouston Park is not managed or enforced by the Council, the event organisers arrange for this, and pay for this, themselves.

Your support will be considered and included within the final report which will inform the decision. Once a decision has been taken in regards to these proposals I shall write to you again and advise of the outcome.
