They've been fully trained and equipped for their new roles. We've had a great response to our appeal for staff to take on new roles. I'd like to thank everyone who has offered their support."

Jimmy said: "In our normal role we've been working on implementing changes to the frequency of kerbside collections across the city. This job is giving us first-hand experience of what the refuse collection teams do so we can better understand what's involved. We're glad to be helping our refuse collection colleagues. I've been really impressed with the level of hard work that the teams carry out on a day-to-day basis."

"We are working with our colleagues at the Alarm Receiving Centre (ARC) to investigate and respond to alarms activated by elderly vulnerable citizens. We also notify the city's emergency services of incidents requiring attention such as break-ins, fires and vandalism across council assets.

"The team is doing an outstanding job in difficult circumstances to support local communities, and keep both people and buildings safe."
