Staying well when coping with loss and grief

Many people are experiencing loss as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic: the tragic loss of loved ones, the loss of jobs and income, the loss of the familiar and comfortable routines that we previously took for granted.

There are many, less obvious losses that can also affect our wellbeing such as missed graduations or birthday celebrations, postponed weddings, cancelled travel plans or social events we were looking forward to and now won't happen.

It's important to acknowledge the grief you feel for these losses. Here are some tips to help:

Take notice

- Recognise and take notice of the difficult feelings you are experiencing so that you can process them and move forward.
- Focus on the present rather than worrying about losses that haven't actually happened yet (and may never happen). This will help you to feel less overwhelmed more grounded.

Stay connected

- Connecting with others is vital to our wellbeing, especially during these difficult times.
- Share your feelings with trusted friends and family members by phone, video, and online.

Supporting the city's economic regeneration



The planning and building standards teams at Development and Regeneration Services (DRS) are working hard to provide services as near to normal as possible.

In April this year 211 planning decisions were issued - almost exactly that granted in April 2019; and 202 building warrants were issued - almost the same as the previous year.

Forbes Barron, Head of Planning and Building Standards said: "This has been achieved thanks to a huge effort from the planners and building surveyors who mostly do not have full access to the office systems and have created innovative workarounds for the usual procedures.

"I'd like to particularly thank some of the key staff in Development Management (Planning Applications), Building Standards, Service Development and CBS who have all worked incredibly hard to keep the cogs turning. Many members of our teams are working outwith their usual responsibilities and have adapted remarkably to new processes.

"It's not just about processing applications though. We're also maintaining and progressing projects which will deliver regeneration and investment on the ground once lockdown lifts. This is crucial to build an environment

where the economy can recover and still maintain well designed places which contribute to the wellbeing of the people who use them."

Sarah Shaw, Business Manager added: "Finding new ways of working is essential to enable more staff to have access to equipment to support them to support service delivery. We're continuing to work with our partners in the SIT (Strategic Innovation Team) to roll out IT support to help us replicate office facilities online such as access to our databases for issuing consents, and videoconferencing.

"Making better use of technology will help us to communicate better with developers and to deal with enquiries and comments from the public about planning processes and applications.

"The work that we are doing will support the city's construction industry to get back to work once lockdown eases and will contribute to the economic growth and regeneration of the city." **Supporting the city's economic growth and regeneration.**
