Spaces for People - city centre works starting today



Work starts today to install temporary travel infrastructure on key streets around George Square, as part of the council's **Spaces for People** programme which is providing extra space for physical distancing to protect public health and suppress a resurgence of COVID-19.

These short-term measures which will include closing some roads to traffic, and the widening of footways; will make it easier for people to move around our city centre and more readily access shops, businesses, community facilities and public transport hubs including Queen Street Station.

Works should last for approximately 10 weeks. Please note that no work will be carried out on Saturday 27 June and Sunday 28 June 2020.

The following roads will be closed to all traffic, except cycles:

- George Square (East)
- George Square (West)

OFFICIAL

- Hanover Street (local access via Ingram St)
- North Hanover Street (northbound bus gate) this is to assist with pedestrian movement around Queen Street Station. The southbound lane will remain open.

The following footways will be widened in the area immediate to George Square:

- George Square (the taxi rank and disabled parking bays remain on the north side)
- North Hanover Street (northbound)
- Queen Street
- Cochrane Street

- Hanover Street
- George Street
- St Vincent Place

On-street parking will be suspended in the affected areas, with extra space for people made available by repurposing the immediate road space usually occupied by parked vehicles.

There will be limited amendment to the existing bus stops and specific changes will be notified to Operators through SPT. Additional temporary taxi ranks and disabled bays have already been provided on adjacent streets.



The council appointed a team to help prepare ambitious regeneration action plans for these four districts. The team, working closely with City Centre Regeneration in DRS, have now launched a website and Freephone line to help engage with people in the coming months.

These distinctive city centre areas will each have a District Regeneration Framework (DRF) to guide their future development. A DRF is a 10-year regeneration planning framework and action plan, and each DRF will guide the city centre's physical, social and economic regeneration. The DRFs support both Glasgow's City Development Plan and the City Centre Strategy.

The team invites comments and ideas about how to improve these four districts in future and to share thoughts on how these districts feel now and ideas about how they could and should be improved.

The consultation team especially want to hear views on how it can be made easier to get around the city centre; how streets and open spaces can be improved; and on the mix of activities required to create a thriving, active city centre in the future.


