GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL (BARRAS (NORTH)) (TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT) ORDER 2014 (VARIATION NO 04) (MELBOURNE STREET) ORDER 202_

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

This Order is proposed to facilitate the Collegelands Calton Barras – Meat Market Wellpark Link project, with the aim of improving cyclist infrastructure and facilities on Melbourne Street to create an active travel route linking with Duke Street as part of a wider development of the area.

The route, which begins south of Wellpark Street, continues to migrate north along Melbourne Street, then terminates at the most northern end of the street at its junction with Duke Street.

Details of the proposals are as follows:-

• The creation of a segregated two way cycle track on the east side of Melbourne Street (northern section).
