

Play Sufficiency Assessment Children 3 – 8 Years Old

September 2022



How to use this tool:

Glasgow City Council are undertaking play sufficiency assessments to find out where our children can play outdoors across the city. We would like to involve the children so that their voice can be heard. Discussion and talking prompts are provided.

Children in nursery settings and primary classes can be invited to talk about the outdoor play spaces that they use near where they live at various points in their day.

Once you have introduced and discussed outdoor spaces and play with your group/class of children, we have provided an <u>online tool</u> where you can identify a nearby space. We would like you to visit that space with the children so that they can give their input on whether or not it meets their play needs.

Note: This tool aligns with <u>Realising the Ambition: Being Me</u>.

"I need spaces that encourage me to test my sense of risk. I need you to notice when I need you to step in to support my risky play and when you should step back"



Discussion and Talking Prompts:

Where children play outdoors and what they do

- Where are your favourite places to cycle, wheel and scoot?
- Can you tell me about places you can climb, swing and clamber?

Where children can be creative

Being creative, imaginative, and pretending

- Where can I go outdoors to use my imagination?
 - o To pretend to be a giant, a monster, a dinosaur, an aeroplane....?
- In those places, tell me what kind of things you play with?
 - Building dens, using chalk, splashing in water, digging...?

Where children play with their friends and family/carers outdoors

Time to play together

- Think about places outdoors you go with family and friends to play.
 - o Tell me about those places and what you do there?


