Agree generally with taking a broad and high-level approach as to when a full review is required in order to provide certainty in the planning system. The Council welcomes the proposal to make the amendment process more responsive and streamlined version of the full review process, whilst balancing the need for due process, including appropriate justification and consultation on the proposed amendment. We note that NPF4 can be amended at any time but that there is a desire to use this sparingly.

Generally, if more than half of NPF4 needs changing then a full review makes sense. However, it is noted that some policies and national developments are more significant than others and it could be the case that altering less than half of NPF4 has a significant bearing on the overall policy direction and delivery of NPF4. For example, a major change to Policies 1 through to 3 could well have a major knock on impact on the other policies. The local impact of policies also requires consideration. If for example some of the proposed change to policy themes specifically applied to Glasgow or say National Developments were removed (such as Clyde Mission/Metro) – this may have a disproportionate impact on society/economics of the city. Furthermore – our approach to CDP2 is on the early premise of landing NPF4 locally in a way that it works for Glasgow. If mid cycle the Scottish Government seek a pretty significant change to the system (but less than half of policies/national developments so not requiring a full review) then this would have impacts for our LDP Process too. Rather than simplifying things these arbitrary triggers might cause further uncertainty and additional loss of faith in the planning system. A sustained period of planning normality is required to set out our new style LDPs and provide some certainty for the sake of being able to deliver the 2019 Act and for the economy/environment/communities.

Incremental change where one or a few changes at a time that would eventually lead to half or more of NPF4 being changed needs consideration. Would there be a trigger mechanism if this threshold was reached.

With regards the circumstances for an amendment, the threshold needs consideration in producing an update to the LDP Guidance. It would be useful if the circumstances for an amendment were consulted on. In a city context with a large population there will for example be regular new policy issues arising and multiple Local Place Plans may come forward. Further detail is required on the expectation as to when amendments are made. More guidance is required relating to amendments regarding housing land given the potentially significant impact of this. Guidance should also cover when an amendment is required and when planning guidance could be produced instead. This would assist in reducing requests for amendments and potential resource implications.
