SCREENING DETRMINATION FOR GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL'S INNER EAST STRATEGIC DEVELOPMENT FRAMEWORK FINAL DRAFT

This letter sets out the Council's determination under Section 8(1) of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 on whether or not a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) is required for the Council's Inner East Strategic Development Framework (Final Draft).

SEA Screening Process

The screening process involved consulting the following Consultation Authorities on whether the Inner East SDF (final draft) is likely to have significant environmental effects:

- Historic Environment Scotland (HES)
- Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA)
- NatureScot

In addition to consulting with the above bodies, the Council has also taken into account the criteria set out in Schedule 2 of the 2005 Act in determining whether or not the final draft of Inner East SDF is likely to have significant environmental effects.

The Council wrote to the Consultation Authorities on 8th June 2023. Their responses are summarised as follows:

Historic Environment Scotland (HES)	In light of the information and reasoning set out within the screening report, we agree with your view that there are unlikely to be significant environmental effects for the historic environment.	None
Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA)	In accordance with Section 9(3) of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 we have reviewed the screening report using the criteria set out in Schedule 2 of the Act. In regard to our main areas of interest (air, water, soil, human health, material assets and climatic factors) we agree with the conclusions of the screening report that the proposed PPS is unlikely to have significant environmental effects. NatureScot	We understand that the Inner East SDF provides the detailed spatial strategy in support of the City Development Plan Policy CDP2. The SDF does not establish any new policies or support potential future development proposals that would be contrary to the policies of the adopted City Development Plan, which has been subject to the full SEA process. The Inner East SDF screening report provides comprehensive details of the previous SEA work carried out for the City Development Plan, together with the three consultation authorities' responses to the consultation on the draft SDF. We found this to be very helpful context and shows a thorough consideration of both the previous SEA findings, and the consultation responses. Overall, we agree with the Council's conclusion that the SDF is not likely to have any significant environmental effects.	None

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Reasons for the Determination
