SCREENING DETERMINATION FOR GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL'S SG12: DELIVERING DEVELOPMENT SUPPLEMENTARY GUIDANCE

This statement sets out the Council's determination under Section (8)1 of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 on whether or not a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) is required for the above Supplementary Guidance

SEA Screening Process

The Screening process involved consulting the following Consultation Authorities on whether the Supplementary Guidance is likely to have significant environmental effects:

- Historic Environment Scotland;
- Scottish Environment Protection Agency; and
- NatureScot

In addition to consulting the above bodies, the Council has also taken into account the criteria set out in Schedule 2 of the Act in determining whether or not the Supplementary Guidance is likely to have significant environmental effects.

The Council wrote to the Consultation authorities on 2 November 2023. The responses are summarised as follows:
