

**NOTICE OF HEARING SESSION  
THE COMPULSORY PURCHASE BY PUBLIC AUTHORITIES

COMPULSORY PURCHASE ORDER 2023**

The Scottish Ministers, through the Scottish Government's Planning and Environmental Appeals Division (DPEA) and under the terms of The Compulsory Purchase by Public Authorities (Inquiries Procedure) (Scotland) Rules 1998, are currently considering the above compulsory purchase order.

A reporter, Mr Paul Cackette CBE, LL.B (Hons), Dip LP, NP, has been appointed to consider the justification for and objections to the order and to report his findings and recommendations to Scottish Ministers

The reporter has decided that a hearing session should be held to assist in his consideration of the order. This session will take place virtually on Thursday 08 February 2024 at 10:00 and will run for 1 day.
